# TOPIC: Trends in accounting policies and their impacts

# <u>SPEAKER: CA Asha M, Accounting</u> Advisory Services, KPMG

The young and energetic speaker took the students through the changing dynamic regulations and changes in accounting. She also briefed us on recent trends in accounting with relation to artificial intelligence. She emphasized on how artificial intelligence can never replace human intelligence.

Ms. Asha also spoke about interesting concepts like Personal Data Privacy Act, Companies Act amendments, Insolvency and Bankruptcy code's complexity and difficulty bin implementation. She briefed us on how e-accounting and how the transition from maintaining ledger books to maintaining accounts online has changed. Cashless economy and digitalized transactions change the way accounting transactions are recorded. She also emphasized on the new revenue standard which has made changes in revenue recognition of businesses all over. She asked us to constantly remain updated about the changes in the commerce regime.



She concluded by saying don't forget to think in the process of rethinking. Aim high! Dream big! You can always win.

## SESSION 2

PART A: TOPIC: Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016.

# <u>SPEAKER: Mr. Vinod Sunder Raman,</u> <u>Practicing Companies Secretary, Insolvency</u> <u>professional</u>

In the first part of the second session of the seminar, Mr. Vinod Sunder Raman told about what insolvency is, how its accounting is done and its 2 Acts namely; Presidential Amendment Act and Provisional Amendment Act. He also talked about Bankruptcy, differences between Insolvency and Bankruptcy. He told the reasons why there will be defaults during repayment and also



told some remedies for it too. He taught us some new concepts like DRT, RDDBFI etc. He talked about the drawbacks of existing systems. He taught us about how to apply for Insolvency and Bankruptcy code. Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process was also talked by him. He told about the time limit and orders on admission. In Bankruptcy he talked about liquidation, liquidators and secured creditors. He also spoke about fast track insolvency too. He finally told about the career opportunities as an Insolvency Professional.

She talked about what agreements it has made and its intermediaries. She also talked, in detail, about the Act, its evolution, its importance, objectives, establishment of Real Estate Regulatory Authority, the scope covered, and their implications in the real estate industry.


In addition to this, she also explained the basic terminologies like Carpet area, promoter, etc., which made us understand the Act better.

### **SESSION 3**

# <u>TOPIC: Controls in virtual financial systems</u> and forensic audit

# <u>SPEAKER: CA Anand Jangid, Partner, AJA</u> <u>& Co.</u>

After the introduction to the session by Shraddha, Mr. Anand took the class. He basically talked about big challenges in finance and accounting which are nothing but bad debts, frauds etc., and also the





According to him the solution to the problem is Blockchain Technology. There are basically 13 intermediaries involved in the simple process of payment, but this blockchain technology will eliminate these intermediaries. He talked about how having a centralized system can make hacking easy because everything is at one place, there comes the need of decentralization. For that he talked about new virtual financial system which is nothing but distributed decentralized ledger. He also told that block chain is nothing but distributed ledger where it can be seen and kept everywhere. The distributed ledger can contain any type of financial and nonfinancial transactions. He also told that even though decentralization and distribution are sounding same but they are not. Decentralization basically mean not controlled by single entity whereas distributed means that everybody has ledger. He also talked how it is protected with the help of cryptography and digital signature and the entries are hard to change. As per him the block chain is basically the pages in a book. He told us an example of a construction industry where there may be six parties of interest keeping six books of accounting where block chain helps it to be a one book of accounting where everybody can post.

In a nutshell he said that the block chain is the combination of shared ledger, cryptography, consensus and shared contract. He also told the demerits of block chain as well which includes huge data entry, quantum computing can help for the people to hack the information.

He gave an example of Ripple where money transactions takes less amount of time and less amount of money compared to traditional banking transactions. But the problem of the auditors is how to audit the block chain transactions. They are still concentrating on challenges in of the question how? He also talked about the traditional contract vs. smart contract. As the end of his session he concluded saying that the block chain technology is going to change the way we think. At 4.15pm the seminar reached its conclusion with the valedictory, which was anchored by Jonathan. Dr. Himachalapathy gave the token of appreciation to Mr. Anand. And later on the vote of thanks by Ms. Lynet, coordinator, post graduate department.

### <u>AGAMYA 2019</u>

AGAMYA 2019, the national level student seminar themed "PIONEERING BUSINESS PRACTICES FOR A GLOBALISED TOMORROW", was kick started with the inaugural ceremony. The Vice Principal, Ms. Ravi Darshini welcomed the gathering and addressed the students on importance of changing technology. Dr. Shubhra Rahul, our head of the department delivered the concept note of the seminar. A video was screened in the ceremony, which depicted the theme of the seminar. A book

with selected papers from the conference was also launched by the dignitaries. The keynote Speaker and the Chief Guest Mr. Vijay Singh Rathore from Inner Wave addressed the audience. Sir spoke about emerging technologies, investment opportunities, FDI, Fintech, artificial intelligence and so on. The session was very interactive and crisp. Sir also spoke about ease of doing business. The inaugural ended with a closure note by the Student Co-ordinator Ms. Lynet. # **INDUSTRIAL VISITS**

### 1 M.Com

The industrial visit to Mysore sandal soap factory and various other small and medium scale industries was organized on16th august 2018 for 1M.Com (regulars).

The R&D head explained the various products available and the methodologies used in the process of preparing various soaps and other products and then later various plants and trees used in manufacturing of soaps and other products. We were taken to the manufacturing unit and they explained the process through which soaps are manufactured and then they also explained us about the placements and internship programs available.



Post lunch we were taken to various small and medium scale enterprises in and around Peenya. The MSME's that we visited were the manufacturers of various small components of cars and bikes. The products that they manufactured were like screws, nails, door-fixtures, bolts etc.

## 2 M.Com

The students of II M.Com (Regular) went for an industrial visit on to Mysore. The industrial visit to Mysore silks sandalwood oil division of KSDL was organized on 20<sup>a</sup> August, 2018. The process of how strands of silk are made into the cloth materials, especially sarees that Mysore silks are known for were explained to the students. There, we were able to take a look at different processes involved like twisting, warping, weaving, pinning, dyeing and ironing, leading to making of sarees, of range up to lakhs of rupees. We were able to understand the process better, and were able to identify the sources of materials, such as the silk cocoons from



Ramanagara, and gold thread from Surat. Later in the sandalwood oil division of KSDL, we were explained how sandal, a semi-parasitic plant has so many useful, from the immature wood, to the charred sandal, and also how oil is extracted from the sandalwood.

# 1 M.Com (IB)

On the 21st of August 2018, the students of 1st MIB had an opportunity to visit KSDL (Karnataka Soaps and Detergent ltd.), one of India's monopolistic soap manufacturing unit nestled amongst a hub of industries in Bangalore. The eager lot were welcomed at the site by one of the R&D personnel. The students took a tour of the plant after a brief on the company's history, facts and operations.



The heritage passed on by his Royal highness Krishna Raja Wadiyar IV during 1916 which was then engineered by Sir M. Visvesharaiah. The class then headed to visit few small scale industries which dealt with the manufacturing and coating of spare parts. Students had the opportunity to experience the working condition of small scale industry workers. The day ended with a lot of fun and experiential learning.

## 1 M.Com (FA)

On 28<sup>th</sup> August 2018 the first year students of M.Com financial analysis went to their industrial visit to the Mysore sandal soap factory here in Bangalore Yeshwanthpur. There the factory employee showed us around the factory and the premises. There we came to know how Mysore sandal soap is made and also many varieties of the Mysore sandal soap that is made.



Later on we visit the industrial town in Rajajinagar around 1.15pm. In this place there are many small scale industries are situated where they produce small industry items that would be used in large scale industries as their components. The some products that were produced are nut and bolt, parts for clutch and breaks. They told that these items will used by the companies as raw materials in the manufacturing. And these small scale industries are promoted by Government.

# **RURAL EXPOSURE CAMP**

### 1 M. Com

The students of 1<sup>st</sup> M.Com left Bangalore on 29th October, 2018 night to Raichur for their rural exposure. We reached Raichur station around the next morning around 10 am. We were taken to Loyola campus in Manvi. After which a small orientation about the rural camp was given. That evening we were taken to a small village about 25kms from Manvi called Pannur.

We were asked to stay along with the villagers in their houses. We were 40 students divided into 20 groups of 2 students each. Each group was allotted to one self-help group member. We had planned to have some games and programmes for the village children that evening. That evening we had lots of games and programmes for the children and we distributed Chocolates as well.

We had organised various games like kabaddi, tug of war, bombing the city etc. The prize for the same were distributed after the event. A few programmes like dance and role play based on girl child awareness were put up by us for them. On the last day of the camp we left Manvi. We had an evaluation session at Loyola campus with the priests and we headed back to Bangalore that night.

The day started with gardening where the girls and boys worked on loosening soil for saplings. This was the morning routine on all days. The students interacted with the kids in Loyola School. During free time games were planned for the kids and adults in Haravi, a small village in Manvi. A cultural show was put up for the villagers. There was also play to create awareness on hygiene, cleanliness and women empowerment. There was an evaluation on the last day and had a discussion on the experiences. The students returned to Bengaluru on the 14<sup>th</sup> of November, 2018 morning with tons of memories.

### **1 M.Com (FA)**

The class of 1<sup>st</sup> M.Com FA went for their outreach programme in Pannur, Maanvi, Raichur district. It was a three day camp starting from 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2018 to 8<sup>th</sup> November 2018. On 4<sup>th</sup> we reached Raichur. Once we reached Pannur, our class was split into 3 group, where each group went to different village and spent their 3 days there. The team A consisting of 20 people went to Ramathanal. Teams A and C put together a village map explaining various aspects as well as identifying the issues faced by them, while team B, on the second day, conducted a meeting with self-help groups and talked to them about the problems they face and solutions for them. The teams conducted games for the children of the village on the first day, while on the second day each team conducted cultural programmes for the people in the village.
