## Resilience and Diversity

The academic year 2023-24 returned to a state of near normalcy. Academic, sports, cultural, extension, outreach, and co-curricular activities proceeded as scheduled. The campus once again buzzed with vibrancy after a brief period of uncertainty spanning about three years due to the pandemic. This resurgence towards normalcy is a clear testament to the resilience exhibited by all the Josephites at SJCC.

Resilience manifested itself in various aspects. In the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), SJCC moved to the 65th position in the college category. The college's rankings improved in surveys conducted by The Week, India Today, and Outlook magazines. Furthermore, SJCC maintained its winning streak in various inter-collegiate cultural and sports events.

We proudly hosted our inaugural TEDx event, featuring 11 speakers from diverse backgrounds who shared their narratives of resilience. In addition, Tribe 2024, a first of its kind conference at SJCC on Behavioural Economics, was organized by the Department of Economics. In our first-ever intercollegiate literary fest, Vividha, from the Department of English, we witnessed a unique attempt at getting the staff of SJCC involved in telling stories through objects, *Kathegala Mane*.

SJCC has introduced The Centre for Digital Learning and Education (CDLE) to introduce a blended teaching and learning model for open elective courses and mandatory courses like Indian Constitution, Environmental Studies, and Yoga. This attempts to prioritize students' needs and integrate technology to enhance the learning experience and revolutionize teaching pedagogy.

In addition to resilience, SJCC upheld its rich diversity. Throughout the academic year, undergraduate students hailed from 10 different countries, 23 states, and 3 union territories of India, representing 38 different mother tongues. Similarly, in the postgraduate section, students came from 4 countries, 15 states, and 3 union territories of India, speaking 20 different mother tongues.

The harmonious blend of a diverse student community and a complementary teaching fraternity made the year a truly memorable one. I am pleased to present to you this testament of our achievements.

# A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE





## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC), formerly a part of St. Joseph's College, established in the year 1882, is managed by the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES). The BJES is a unit of a Catholic religious order called the Society of Jesus founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola in 1540. The Department of Commerce was established at St. Joseph's College in the year 1949 which later became an independent college with its building on Brigade Road in the year 1972.

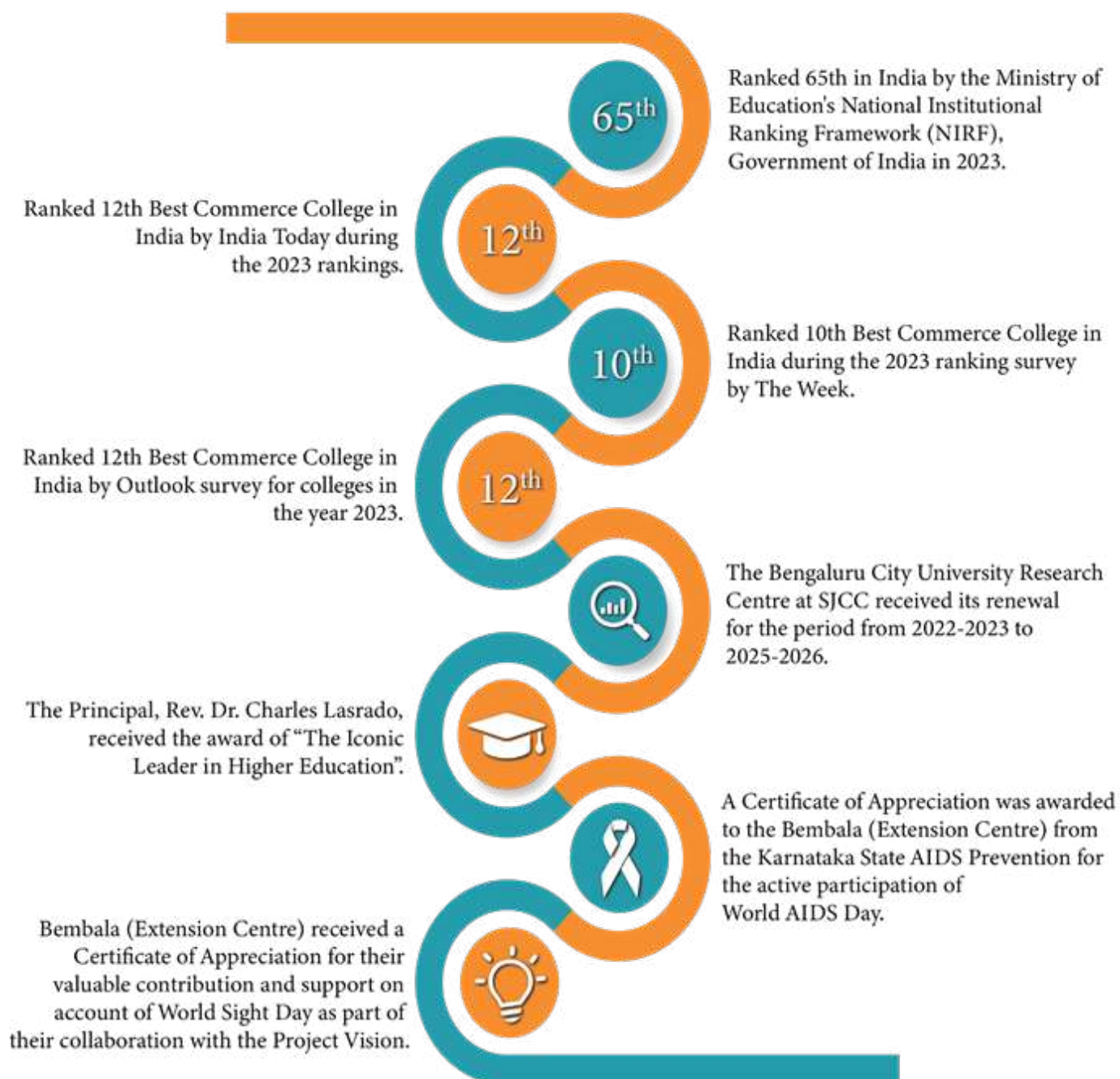
The college has in its vision a model for higher education which encourages individuals to dream of a socially just world and in its mission a strategy to empower individuals in realising that dream.

To impart quality education, the college has been innovating in all aspects of higher education. These innovations were further bolstered with the granting of autonomous status to the college by UGC in September 2005. From then on, the college has taken the lead in reforming curriculum and syllabi, examination and evaluation patterns, and teaching and learning processes through the Board of Studies, the Academic Council, and the Governing Council is composed of eminent academicians, industry experts, and notable alumni.

The college has undergone four cycles of NAAC accreditation starting from the year 2000 in which it secured 'five stars'. The college was graded an 'A' grade, in the years 2007 and 2012. And recently in February 2021, the college was re-accredited with an 'A++' grade and a CGPA of 3.57/4. SJCC is one of the first colleges in Karnataka and the very few institutions in the country to have secured an A++ grade in the fourth cycle under the Revised Accreditation Framework (RAF). In 2010, the college was declared a 'College with Potential for Excellence'. In 2011, SJCC was recognised as a Research Centre by Bengaluru City University. The BCU Research Centre at SJCC received its renewal for the period from 2022-2023 to 2025-2026. The college is ranked 65th in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) ratings of the Ministry of Education, Government of India in 2023.

Since its inception, the college has offered diverse programmes in Commerce and Management. The college aims at holistic development of students fostering in them academic excellence, social concern, and character formation; shaping them to become "men and women for and with others". The motto of the College 'Fide et Labore' (Faith and Toil) serves as the foundation for the vision and mission of the college.

# TEDX SJCC





## TEDx SJCC

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) organized TEDx SJCC on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2023. The inaugural TED initiative of SJCC was themed "*Narratives of Resilience*," featuring eleven speakers who shared snippets of their journeys and ideas. TEDx SJCC hosted eleven speakers across four sessions. The inaugural ceremony started with a welcome note by Dr. Charles Lasrado SJ, the principal, followed by Mr. Merwin Abraham Mathew, co-convenor of TEDx SJCC, who presented the concept note. The organizing team then screened the TEDx SJCC trailer, and the inauguration ceremony concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Christina Aroojis, the convenor of TEDx SJCC.

The first session commenced with a talk by Mr. Binod Shankar, a Chartered Accountant, CFA Charter holder, and Board Member at Heriot-Watt. He is also the author of the book "Let's Get Real: 42 Tips for the Stuck Manager." Mr. Shankar described how he used the power of anger as a catalyst to achieve different milestones in his life. The second speaker, Rajdeep Manwani, Director of Academic Research at Sindhi College, a Motivational Speaker, and Life Coach, discussed various ways for individuals to boost their self-worth and unearth hidden potential. He emphasized the importance of staying positive despite negative comments. The third speaker of the first session was the legendary playback singer and actor Rajesh Krishnan. His interactive session, titled "From Studio to Screen: The Journey of Rajesh Krishnan," covered interesting episodes of his professional and personal journey, moderated by Ms. Vijayashanthi Murthy, Assistant Professor in the Department of English at SJCC. Krishnan shared insights into his musical journey, considering music as the most truthful story and a guiding force in his life. He also narrated how his admiration for the singing prowess of SP Balasubrahmaniam helped him evolve as a singer and how his passion for trying new things led to new career options such as dubbing and acting.

The second session featured talks by Ms. Akkai Padmashali, Ms. Bhargavi Venkatram, and Ms. Dilshad Master. Ms. Akkai Padmashali, an Indian transgender activist, motivational speaker, and singer, centred her talk on transgender parenting, advocating for more inclusive spaces. Ms. Bhargavi Venkatram, a Carnatic Vocalist, shared her journey in the world of music, emphasizing how her family's musical background propelled her into music at a young age. She continued to train in classical music throughout college, balancing her passion with education. Dilshad Master, Director at Bulls Adventure and Outward-Bound India-Himalaya, narrated her resilient journey, emphasizing how to turn setbacks into stepping stones by reimagining resilience and embracing unpredictability.

The third session began with Mr. Guru Prasad, an RJ at Radio Mirchi 98.3, illustrating the power of narration through interesting anecdotes. He emphasized the

significance of storytelling in everyday conversations, believing that narratives can effect change and that the power of narration is a master key to enter people's minds. Mr. Biju Dominic, Chief Evangelist at Fractal Analytics, discussed his views and experiences on the often-ignored truth about human behaviour—the power of the unconscious—and how it can positively influence decision-making.

The final session featured talks by Ms. Cheryl Dutta, Dr. Vineet Gupta, and Mr. Rishi Pardal. Ms. Cheryl Dutta, an Air Force Veteran, Life and Transformation Coach, and the first woman helicopter pilot in India, spoke about pushing limits with fearless passion and emphasized the significance of resilience in pursuing one's passion. Dr. Vineet Gupta, Head of Medical Oncology & Hematology at Sakra World Hospital, shared his views on the lifestyle changes needed to prevent cancer, calling cancer a "silent pandemic ravaging humanity." Mr. Rishi Pardal, former CEO & Managing Director at United Breweries, discussed his experience of leading a company during the pandemic, emphasizing the support he extended to his employees despite losses. He described how he considered the pandemic an opportunity to implement new strategies by diversifying products, highlighting the importance of standing with team members during challenging times.

TEDx SJCC concluded with the screening of an after-movie capturing memorable moments throughout the day. All participants received participation certificates and a TEDx kit with eco-friendly goodies. TEDx SJCC encapsulated the spirit of TED through heart-rending narratives and ideas worth spreading.

## TRIBE'23

The Department of Economics, SJCC, in association with IBEN, IISc, Fractal, IIMB and IIT Madras, conducted a flagship event of Behavioural Economics consisting of three main parts. The coordinators of the event were Dr Jhumur Samaddar Roy (SJCC), Mr. Bhushan Kumar (Fractal), Ms. Junofy (IBEN) and Dr Vishal (IISC). The first event, an international online lecture on behavioural science, was held on 16th July 2023 by Dr. Dilip Soman, University of Toronto, titled, "Behavioural Science: Past, Present and Future." The next event was Nudge-athon, a behavioural economics-themed hackathon, conducted at IISc on the 12th of August, 2023. The final event, the grand finale, was a conference titled TRIBE, held on the 9th of September, 2023. The conference was attended by over 200 corporates and more than 50 faculty and students.

Ms. Jethina James introduced the speaker, Dr. Junofy Rozarina, CEO of Beyond Nudge and IBEN. The talk titled "The Power of Behavioural Sciences" touched on human irrationality, decision-making, system one and two thinking, heuristics, and biases. Dr. Junofy highlighted the importance of teaching Behavioural Science in schools and emphasized how people can apply it in their everyday lives. She also mentioned the need to adhere to ethics when dealing in behavioural economics.

A panel discussion on "Research in Behavioural Economics" followed the talk, including experts from academia and industry: Dr. Ritwik Banerjee, Associate Professor at IIM-Bangalore; Dr. Vishal Singh, Associate Professor at the Centre for Product Design and Manufacturing, IISc; Mr. Shubhabrata Roy, Founder of BIAS Inc, a behavioural science firm in Delhi; Dr. Jhumur Samaddar Roy, Department Head of Economics at St. Joseph's College of Commerce; and Ms. Pragati Vishwakarma, head of the UX Research team for Amazon India. The panel was introduced by Ms. Jethina James and moderated by Dr. Jhumur S Roy.

The panel explored the differences between academic and corporate research, the challenges of generalization, and the importance of practical knowledge. Notable lines included "you either live by design or accident," and "behavioral science is an umbrella." Intriguing questions about ideal industry students, academic-corporate collaboration, and the use of neuroeconomics were addressed. The session ended with Principal Fr. Charles Lasrado SJ felicitating the panelists.

Dr. A M Sheela introduced the speaker, Mr. Biju Dominic, Chief Evangelist at Fractal Analytics and Chairman of FinalMile Consulting. He delivered an enlightening talk on "Human Behaviours Beyond Rational Man." Mr. Biju touched upon the complexities of human behaviour, emphasizing its irrational nature and the challenges in understanding it within organizations. He drew parallels between the human brain and computer science, advocating for a multidisciplinary approach. He quoted Francis Crick's perspective on electrochemical reactions in the brain and the role of unconscious processes in decision-making, discussing concepts like the ethno

lab and designing for the unconscious. He concluded by emphasizing the importance of embracing new tools and approaches to unlock the future of understanding the unconscious.

The second panel for the day was introduced by Mr. Sam Stanley and moderated by Mr. Bhushan Kumar. The panel discussion on "Behavioural Economics in the Private Sector" featured the experts Ms. Divya Radhakrishnan, a consumer research specialist with 7 years of experience in behavioural economics; Mr. Nikhil Ravichandar, the Director of Behavioural Science at ANZ; Mr. Jafar Baig, a founding member of the behavioural science unit at Swiggy; Mr. Bhushan Kumar, the Lead Behaviour Architect at Fractal Analytics; and Ms. Divya Chadha, who leads the User Research initiative at Disney+Hotstar. The panel discussed how behavioural science has evolved as a significant tool for organizations, irrespective of size, to understand human behaviour as a business problem. They emphasized the importance of behavioural patterns and the need to understand what works for whom, when, and why. Ethical considerations were also addressed, with Ms. Divya Radhakrishnan mentioning the "7 Deadly Sins of Behavioural Science." Overall, the discussion highlighted the crucial role of Behavioural Science in the private sector.

The third session began with an enlightening talk on "Future of Behavioural Economics" by Ms. Divya Balakrishnan, the co-founder of Mentza, a live audio platform, introduced to the audience by Mr. Shravan Abraham. She emphasized the role of Behavioural Economics in understanding choices and nudges for behaviour change. She stressed that communication alone cannot drive behaviour change and that BE goes beyond mere nudges. Two major issues in Behavioural Science were discussed: the misuse of nudges as quick fixes and behavioural science's limited role as a "fixing" tool. She highlighted the need to tailor interventions for small-scale changes and policy implementation. The audience raised thought-provoking questions, including the relationship between behavioural science and design.

Dr. Sneha Rai introduced the third panel comprising Mr. Shekhar Menon, Ms. Srilakshmi, Ms. Krithi Chouhan, and Ms. Divyani Diddi, the moderator. The panel discussion was conducted on "Behavioural Economics in the Social Sector." The panelists debunked the notion that the social sector is slow to change and highlighted the shift towards participatory approaches and evidence-driven policies. They stressed the interdisciplinary nature of behavioral science and emphasized the importance of context in decision-making. Questions were raised about when not to use behavioural science, the meaning of "done" in the social sector, and the definition of "participatory."

## VIVIDHA 2023: An Intercollegiate Literary Festival

### Vividha – Ways of Storytelling

The Department of English hosted its first ever intercollegiate literary fest, Vividha, on the 25th and 27th of September 2023. The festival brought together a diverse range of talents, showcasing storytelling, journalism, art, and literature. A total of 500 students from 18 colleges participated in the festival which featured 14 competitions, two panel discussions, four workshops, and 'Kathegala Mane (House of Stories) - Museum of Material Memory' curated by the students of B.A. English. The festival was inaugurated by Ms. Indu Antony, a medical doctor turned artist in the presence of the Principal Dr. Charles Lasrado, SJ and Head of the Department of English, Mr. Vinay Kambipura. The festival was coordinated by Mr. Thomas Mathew, and the museum by Ms. Vijayshanthi, along with support from the students and staff of the Department of English.

Competitions like Journalistic Storytelling, Sketch a Story, Song Writing, Photo Story, Dialogue Writing, Poetry Writing, Fan Fiction, Elocution, Fill the Bubble, Video Essay, Short Story Writing, and Literature quiz provided students a space for creative expression. The themes for the competitions invited the students to carefully examine the world around them and challenged their creative abilities with language and communication. The festival was open for PU/11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup>, UG and PG students of colleges from Bangalore.

### Workshop on Storytelling

The festival kicked off with an engaging workshop by Ms. Indu Antony, a trans-disciplinary artist whose performances and installations primarily revolves around the notion of spaces and their intangible character in relation to the gendered body as a site of representation. She shared her creative journey, spotlighting projects exploring feminist geography, mob mentality, and the enigmatic Cecelia. Her innovative storytelling, including engagement with police reports and local artisans, broke boundaries and added a unique touch to narrative dissemination.

### Panel Discussion on Journalistic Storytelling

The inaugural day featured a lively panel discussion on journalistic storytelling with journalists Ms. Liffy Thomas, Senior Correspondent and Assistant Editor at The Hindu, Ms. Vishaka George, Senior Editor at People's Archive of Rural India (PARI) and Ms. Indulekha Aravind, Senior Assistant Editor at The Economic Times. The discussion emphasized the importance of factual reporting in the face of misinformation.

### Student Panel

Vividha also featured an exclusive student panel on the topic "Finding Your 'Self' Through Stories" on 27<sup>th</sup> September. The panel members were Yatin Arora of Christ (Deemed-to-be-University), Ananya Mishra of Mount Carmel College, Ananya

Mehta of St. Joseph's University and Santosh Samuel of SJCC. The discussion was moderated by Ms. Amulya B, an award-winning creative writer. Students spoke about their experiences of reading and listening to stories and how the process of reading helped them re-invent their 'selves'.

### **Interactive Workshop on Painting**

An interactive workshop on painting was organized on 25<sup>th</sup> September and the resource person was Ms. Diya Haneena (Mutthulaxmi), a Bangalore based artist. Ms. Diya spoke about telling stories through sketching and interacted with aspiring artists. She narrated her experience of painting, sketching, and telling stories.

### **Creative Writing Workshop**

A creative writing workshop was organized on 27<sup>th</sup> September and the resource person for the workshop was Ms. Amulya B, a creative writer who won the Toto Award for creative writing in English and Kannada. Ms. Amulya narrated her experience of doing creative writing and shared her insights on the form and structure of short stories. More than 80 students from different colleges attend this workshop.

### **Poetry Writing Workshop**

A poetry writing workshop was conducted on 27<sup>th</sup> September and the resource person was Ms. Pratishtha Pandya, a poet and translator at People's Archive of Rural India. Ms. Pratishtha shared her journey as a poet and a translator of poems from Gujarati to English and English to Gujarati. She spoke about how poetry is an effective medium to speak about the body. She asked the participants to write poems and gave them feedback on what they had written. The workshop was attended by 80 students from different colleges.

### **'Kathegala Mane (House of Stories) - Museum of Material Memory'**

Kathegala Mane was a unique attempt at getting the staff of SJCC involved in telling stories through objects. The students of B.A. English invited the staff of SJCC to contribute a material that is dear to them with memories. The students then interviewed the staff members who contributed an object to hear the stories connected to that object, which was then turned into a short narrative. The object and the story were then housed in the Xavier Hall for everyone to view. The materials included watches given by father, grandmother's sari, Palestinian flag, first gifts, baby tooth, items bought with the first salary, letters, and many more objects that told deeply personal stories. The museum was visited by students and staff of SJCC and also by participants of the festival. It was a unique opportunity for the SJCC community to know interesting stories of the staff members. The museum was hosted as part of the literature festival Vividha – 2023.

# **CENTRE FOR DIGITAL LEARNING AND EDUCATION**





## CDLE

The Centre for Digital Learning and Education (CDLE) at SJCC has introduced a blended teaching and learning model for open elective courses and mandatory courses like Indian Constitution, Environmental Studies, and Yoga. Blended learning, a method that prioritizes students' needs and integrates technology to leverage both in-person and online learning environments, has been embraced by St. Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC) to enhance the learning experience and revolutionize teaching pedagogy.

The Blended Learning Model allocates one hour per week for face-to-face contact classes and two hours for non-contact classes. E-content materials including documents, videos, PDFs, and PowerPoint presentations, are meticulously curated and disseminated to students by their respective course instructors.

SJCC commenced the current academic year (2023-2024) on 26 June 2023 and since then, CDLE has organized several meetings. The team conducted orientation sessions for the course instructors of the open elective courses for an effective teaching-learning process. The sessions led by Mr. Vinay Pradeep and Mr. Merwin Abraham Mathew focused on the effective facilitation of a blended mode of learning of the open elective courses through MS Teams.

In the first week of July, members of CDLE set up the tiles, folders, and files for all open elective courses and uploaded the syllabus, videos, reference materials and guidelines. After this, the course instructors were guided in recording and editing lectures. The recording of the instructor's videos took place at the media room of SJCC and SJEC.

In the beginning of the academic year 2023-2024, CDLE completed recording and editing of 16 videos for 8 open elective courses. By the end of the academic year, a total of 56 videos were recorded and edited for different blended mode open elective courses (8 open courses in the odd sem and 4 in the even sem).

CDLE planned a new E- learning Platform built on Linways (SJCC E- learning Platform) in the odd semester. After testing this new platform four different open elective courses and mandatory courses like EVS and IC courses were offered on SJCC E-learning Platform on Linways with a total of 2000+ learners in the even semester.

#### WELFARE MEASURES FOR THE STAFF

The BJES as well as the College management endeavours to persistently make the work environment better in all its institutions and considers the respective staff feedback and suggestions for the better and improved functioning of its institutions.

The college has recently implemented a Cloud-based HRMS and Payroll Software system, a significant enhancement to our welfare staff measures. This integrated solution offers a seamless approach to managing various HR tasks including payroll processing, attendance and leave tracking, performance appraisals, and tax declarations. Additionally, it streamlines the process of accessing important documents such as payslips. With this software, every staff member can conveniently access comprehensive information about their salary, attendance, leaves, and more, all from a centralized platform. This advancement ensures efficiency and transparency in our welfare staff measures, enhancing overall organizational effectiveness.

## **E-GOVERNANCE IN INSTITUTIONAL OPERATIONS**

The institution has adopted appropriate measures to ensure effective workflow and carries out administrative activities efficiently with its state-of-the-art information system and electronic communication services (via the Internet and intranet). For this purpose, the institution has a suitable ERP system with a well-designed policy. The ERP system ensures agility of the operating environment including software and hardware infrastructure. It operates seamlessly with state-of-the-art infrastructure hardware and ERP software, expertly managed by a dedicated team of professionals.

## **FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT AND RESOURCE MOBILISATION**

The institution has developed a rigorous system for the management of financial transactions. The Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES), which runs the institution, has constituted a financial committee that approves the budget of the institution, conducts periodic internal audits, and monitors financial transactions and resource mobilisation.

The Finance Committee of the institution prepares the annual budget based on the specific needs of the institution wherein various departments predict major expenses for renovation and maintenance of the building and allocate the required budget, evaluate and implement the approved budget. The budget is then presented to the Governing Board of Management and once the board approves, it is sent to the President for approval. The President gives his comments and approves the budget. After incorporating suggestions, the budget is finalised.

## **ACCOUNTING PRACTICE**

The Finance Officer is responsible for managing and overseeing the financial operations of the institution. This includes budgeting, financial planning, financial reporting, and ensuring compliance with regulations and policies. The finance office works with other departments to ensure that financial resources are being used effectively and efficiently. In terms of authorisation, the Finance Officer is the authorised signatory for financial transactions and documents and manages financial data from the organisation.

## **FINANCE AUDIT**

Internal audit was carried out by a group of three professionals appointed by the BJES during the academic year. The audit for 2023-24 was done for the books of accounts for the financial year 2022-23. The interim audit was done from November 21 to 25, 2022 and the final audit was done from June 3 to 7, 2022. Another round of internal audit by the Jesuit administration done by a special team of Jesuits known as Revisors was done on October 5, 2023.

## MOBILISATION OF FUNDS AND OPTIMAL UTILISATION OF RESOURCES

The college identifies fees as a primary source of income. Other key sources of funding include:

- UGC funding through UGC management-sponsored research
- UGC MRP grants
- College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) grants
- Special assistance grants under the 12th plan
- Autonomy grant from UGC ICSSR

Additional funds are gathered through the below-mentioned means

- Fees from self-financed programmes offered by the college
- Revenue from the government and private educational exams, conducted in our well-equipped classrooms
- The well-maintained infrastructure of the college enables us to let out space for professional programmes during the break between semesters.
- The computer centre also generates revenue as it is allowed for professional use by other companies or institutions.
- The auditorium has also been used for various programmes. Service charges are levied for the college playground and auditoriums when it is used by the public.
- A list of funding sources is maintained to keep track of all transactions to enable back-tracking whenever necessary.
- At the time of admissions, parents of students are given an Appeal Letter, requesting them to contribute towards the mid-day meal scheme of the college.
- Additionally, a few parents voluntarily donate towards the fees of other underprivileged students and help the institution in terms of its resources.
- Industries and the alumni association of the college extend their financial assistance to the college by sponsoring students and awarding them with scholarships.
- The endowment of funds by the alumni helps the college disburse the money to deserving students coming from economically and socially backward sections of society.
- Students of the college also raise funds for cultural activities and reach out to people affected by natural calamities. Various college associations raise voluntary contributions in kind in order to reach out to the needy. The college prepares a budget for all the grants received in order to ensure effective utilisation of the fund.



- Financial resources in the form of sponsorship, registration fee, entry fee and contributions are raised for seminars, conferences, students' activities, cultural programmes and other programmes organised in the college.



# INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL





## A REPORT ON INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) plays a vital role in maintaining high standards in all the academic activities on campus. IQAC is involved in setting benchmarks in the field of higher education, by applying numerous time-tested pedagogical approaches which transcend traditional classroom lectures. The cell also helps in the holistic development of its student community. IQAC at SJCC focuses primarily on quality enhancement of teaching, learning, evaluation, research, extension and consultancy opportunities.

### QUALITY INITIATIVES OF THE IQAC

- **Expansion and Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) Taskforce**

The IQAC team has expanded to twenty members in accordance with the NAAC AQAR criteria. This structure has been established to facilitate the coordination and facilitation of information for the preparation of the AQAR and other rankings.

- **Preparation for Awards of the Institution**

IQAC submitted an application to the Xavier Board under the 'Best college' and 'Best extension and outreach activities' categories on September 15, 2023. The application for the "Best Institutional Social Responsibility" category was submitted to the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FICCI) on September 12, 2023.

- **Rankings of the Institution**

IQAC facilitated the collection and submission of data for the annual ranking procedures of the institution under The India Today Ranking, the Week Ranking, and the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF). The IQAC also successfully submitted the institution's data for the Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements (ARIIA) rating, which is an initiative by the central government.

- **The SQAC Initiatives**

The SQAC (Student Quality Assurance Cell) was facilitated at the Parent Teachers Association Meeting which was scheduled on September 16, 2023. There were three hundred Parents of first-year students attended the meeting. The collected feedback from the parents will be compiled and used to determine the next course of action.

- **Students Progression Report**

Every year, IQAC records data of students' progression to higher education and the placement of outgoing students. This year, student progression information will be mobilised through the ERP, and the ERP schema has been validated.



### • Transparency Initiatives

IQAC is contributing the required data to Undertaking Transformative Strategies and Actions in Higher Education (UTSAH), an initiative launched by the UGC to enhance the transparency of educational practices for diverse stakeholders.

**THE ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE AUDIT (AAA):** Academic & Administrative Audit Committee was constituted this academic year, 2023-24. The purpose of an academic audit is to encourage programs, departments and the institution to evaluate the quality processes and standards based on predetermined benchmarks and to suggest activities required in producing, assuring, and regularly improving the quality of the whole system including curricular and co-curricular programmes and activities and the infrastructure and support services. The AAA is a peer review process including a self-study and a site visit by peers from inside and outside the institution. A template for a self-study report which records vital information on course completion and any inputs on syllabus alterations and a template for the audit of academic and administrative committees are some of the initiatives taken so far by the AAA.

**LEARNING TUESDAYS - BUILDING TEACHER EFFECTIVENESS:** In a bid for continual growth as educators, the "Learning Tuesdays - Building Teacher Effectiveness" initiative was introduced. These sessions aim to enrich teaching methodologies by exploring personal experiences in teaching, learning, and evaluation. The initiative focuses on fostering professional growth through dialogue and shared experiences.

**WELFARE OFFICERS:** In the academic year 2023-24, our institution took significant strides to enhance student welfare by introducing two pivotal positions: Welfare Officer (Boys) and Welfare Officer (Girls). These officers served as empathetic pillars, providing a supportive environment. As part of this initiative, an event on "Social Media: Etiquette and Legal Implications" was hosted, engaging students from all classes.

### ACTIVITIES OF IQAC

1. The IQAC newsletter was published on 12th December 2023
2. IQAC has submitted the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) 2022-23 of the institution.
3. The AISHE report for the year 2022-23 was submitted in March 15th, 2024. AISHE, the All India Survey on Higher Education, is a Ministry of Human Resource Development initiative.
4. The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS), Student Progression Survey, and Exit Survey of the final year undergraduate and postgraduate students were conducted in March 2024. This year Course (Subject) evaluation is mandatory to all the UG and PG Students and was conducted in March, 2024.

5. A lecture on Leadership and Employability Skills was organised for the students on 7 September 2023 by Ms. Navyashree A, Assistant Manager Audit at Grant Thornton.
6. A one-day workshop on Awareness on NAAC Accreditation and Academic Goals was conducted for the faculty members on 25 October 2023. It was taken by a series of esteemed speakers on various topics.
7. IQAC annually conducts open mic sessions for the students to enhance the quality of teaching and learning. Along with a common open mic a separate session of ladies' open mic is conducted as well, students address their concern in the open mic session. The open mic session includes the IQAC Coordinator and the Vice Principals. IQAC was instrumental in implementing various quality initiatives on campus based on the previous years' open mic session.
8. IQAC has presented the summary of reports from the open house, exit interview, and student satisfaction survey in the Academic Council (TQM) meeting for further action.
9. An institution SWOC analysis session for Faculty was organized by the DTU Steering Committee on 9th February 2024. Dr. Anil Joseph Pinto, Registrar Christ University was the resource person for the session.
10. A session titled 'Contemplating NIRF and NAAC' was organised to provide insights about NIRF and NAAC and to conduct a SWOC analysis on the institution. The session was conducted on 19th October 2023, facilitated by Dr. Raja Jebasingh, Department of Commerce, Dr. Shridhar, IQAC Coordinator and Prof. Muktha.
11. A Three-Day AIACHE Workshop was coordinated for the non-teaching staff from 13th to 15th March 2024 on "Three-Day Capacity Enhancement Workshop on Leveraging AI Tools for Office Automation."

### CURRICULUM DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT

The institution is dedicated to educating students in the fields of Commerce, Business, Arts, and Science alongside ensuring that they grow into self-aware individuals committed to social causes. The implementation of the Outcome-Based Education (OBE) model within the framework of NEP in the institution since the academic year 2021-22, synthesises the teaching and research experience of the faculty and guides the process of designing and developing the curriculum. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) helps enhance students' knowledge across different disciplines of study.

The various stakeholders of the institution are involved in the designing of the curriculum and the latest developments in the fields are taken into consideration for developments in the same. The alumni, subject experts and industry professionals are actively involved in the development of the curriculum to ensure that it is updated and benefits all the stakeholders of the institution.

### NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020

The State Government Task Force suggested NEP-2020 Implementation Framework for the higher educational institutions in Karnataka. The same had been revised from time to time with respect to courses and credits offered by the various programmes at the college. The NEP Committee had been active in meeting and ensuring the incorporation of the revised changes and disseminating the same to higher-ups in the Institution. The Committee had verified and suggested changes to the Model Programme Structures of all the undergraduate programmes before the syllabi were presented at the respective Board of Studies meetings.

### OUTCOME-BASED EDUCATION (OBE)

In the pursuit of academic excellence, our institution remains committed to the principles of Outcome-Based Education (OBE), a transformative approach that focuses on defining specific learning outcomes and aligning educational processes to achieve those outcomes. Through meticulous Outcome-Based curriculum design, Outcome-Based Teaching and Learning process, Outcome-Based continuous assessment, and feedback mechanisms, we ensure that our students acquire not only knowledge, not only essential Skills but also the right attitude and competencies required for success in their chosen fields. OBE empowers our learners to become critical thinkers, effective communicators, and lifelong learners, preparing them for the dynamic challenges of the modern world. We witness the positive impact of this pedagogical model on our student's academic growth and personal development. The

integration of OBE in our educational framework remains instrumental in shaping well-rounded individuals poised for success in their future endeavours.

## MULTIDISCIPLINARY APPROACH

The three-year undergraduate programmes at SJCC offer a wide range of multidisciplinary programmes. Ability, vocational, professional and skill enhancement opportunities are also offered by each programme. The four-year honours programmes across the disciplines of Commerce, Management, Arts, and Science combine conceptual understanding with practical engagement through lab courses, national and international field visits, internships, conferences, workshops, seminars, case study analysis, group discussions and research projects. The students can choose from two specialisations /electives in the fifth and sixth semesters and choose one of the specialisations/electives in the seventh semester to pursue the honours degree in that specialisation/elective.

The Board of Studies composition and functions at the institution are as per the UGC guidelines and constitute the Head of the department, faculty members of the department, university nominee, subject experts, a representative from the industry/corporate sector/allied area, and alumni nominated by the Principal.

#### Department of Kannada

Odd Semester Meeting: 20<sup>th</sup> September 2023

Even Semester Meeting: 16<sup>th</sup> March 2024

Brief Report:

The Board of Studies meeting deliberated on the Kannada course design for the first semester. A uniform syllabus was formulated for all the graduation classes with a special emphasis on orality. Intermediate Kannada curriculum was designed for children who have studied Kannada up to class 10 and decided to pursue graduation. An enhanced functional Kannada curriculum was devised for students who did not learn Kannada at any stage. The syllabus was approved with some minor changes.

#### Department of Hindi

Odd Semester meeting: 9<sup>th</sup> September 2023

Even Semester meeting: 6<sup>th</sup> March 2024

Brief Report:

The Board of Studies meeting deliberated and ratified the language syllabus of B.Com/BBA. As per the decision taken, Hindi will be taught only from the second semester

onwards. In the light of NEP, emphasis is also laid on Hindi IT Tools which will be an embedded applicative unit within the course structure, under the skill-based component. The students will have hands-on experience using Hindi IT tools. The syllabus of the Functional Hindi course was also approved by the committee for the first and second semester respectively.

### **Department of English**

Brief Report:

The Board of Studies Meeting deliberated on the approval of B.A. English Programme syllabus for the coming semester, consideration and approval of changes in the syllabus for B. Com, BBA, BA, and BSc General English for the coming semester and approval of the Board of Examiners and Evaluators list. The syllabus for B.A. English Programme syllabus was presented, proposing syllabi for various core courses for the second and fourth semesters. Notable suggestions included the introduction of applied linguistics in the Introduction to Phonetics and Linguistics module and the inclusion of detective fiction as a genre/text for British Literature up to 1800. The proposed syllabi for General English courses for B. Com, BBA, BA, and BSc were presented for approval.

### **Post Graduate Department of Commerce**

The Board of Studies discussed and approved under two PG programmes- M.Com (Finance & Taxation) and M.Com (Financial Analysis); a new course- Forensic Accounting and Audit was introduced by replacing International Human Resource Management in M.Com (Finance & Taxation) in the II semester and Project Appraisal and Finance in the III semester of M.Com (Financial Analysis).

### **BOS - Foreign Languages**

Odd Semester Meeting: 21st September, 2023

Brief Report:

A review of the lesson delivery number of hours for French, Spanish and German, employment opportunities available to students upon course completion, bridging cultural gaps while learning the respective languages for the students and attempting to provide a holistic learning experience were some of the points discussed.

### **CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT**

Holistic development of students is an important aspect of the institution's education. With professional programmes like BBA Entrepreneurship, ACCA, BPM (Industry Integrated), B. Com (Analytics), and B.Com (Travel and Tourism) the



students widen their scope of employability. The curriculum is enriched with programmes like Advanced Excel, Tally, SPSS Digital fluency, Artificial Intelligence, SAP, Yoga, Environmental Studies, Indian Constitution and Psychological Well-being to give them hands-on experience with skills and creates a multidimensional perspective in them augmenting holistic development of students. Industrial visits, international student exchange programmes and live projects, and exposure to the business world are embedded components of the curriculum. Furthermore, research culture is an integral aspect of the curriculum. Dissertations and minor and major research projects make students industry-ready and manifest the institution's holistic approach towards education. (Details to be found in the Teaching, Learning and Evaluation unit of this report)

### MASSIVE OPEN ONLINE COURSES (MOOCS)

The students of SJCC enrol in various interdisciplinary courses offered in the NPTEL SWAYAM portal. The duration of the courses enrolled is 8 weeks comprising of weekly assignments. On completion of the weekly assignments and satisfying the criteria as per the course, the students are required to take up a final exam in a centralised examination centre. Currently, MOOCs are offered as Open Elective courses only to the 1st and 3rd semester students in the odd semester and 2nd semester students in the even semester. Students started enrolling for MOOCs in June 2023, for the odd semester and December 2023, for the even semester in academic year 2023-2024. There were a few mandatory specifications for the students to follow while enrolling for the courses in SWAYAM. It is communicated to students who enrolled for the MOOCs that it is mandatory to take up the examination scheduled in SWAYAM to become eligible for receiving the certificate.

**Evaluation Procedure:** On completion of the weekly assignments and satisfying the criteria as per the course, the students are required to take up a final exam in a centralised examination centre. The assignments consist of 25% of their overall grade and the final examination consists of 75% of the overall grade.

**Status of Completion:** In the odd semester, 149 students have completed the course. In the even semester, the students are currently preparing to take up the final examination scheduled in the last week of March 2024. On successful completion, the students submit their certificate to the MOOCs coordinator and the marks are updated accordingly.

## ACADEMIC CALENDAR AND TEACHING PLANS

The Academic Calendar has been made available to the students through the college website. The college has an effective mechanism for the preparation and execution of teaching plans. The Vice-Principal ratifies the individual OBE based lesson plans prepared by the subject coordinators, which are then uploaded on the college website.

## STUDENT-CENTRIC LEARNING EXPERIENCES

The learning experience of students at this college is the result of a well-designed teaching-learning process. The needs, interests, and capabilities of students are the primary factors in designing the pedagogy. The college aims to develop competencies such as critical thinking and problem-solving skills through student-centric teaching-learning methods. The teacher, in this context, acts as a facilitator who enhances the learning experience of the students. Experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies are some of the important student-centric methods of teaching-learning process, practised in this college.

**Experiential Learning:** The college prioritises learning through experience and has created student-centric learning programmes such as industrial visits, internship programmes (social, corporate, and start-up internships), workshops, outreach programmes, rural exposure programmes, social visits, etc.

**Participative Learning:** To develop innovative as well as creative thinking skills among students, participative learning in the teaching pedagogy has been adopted. Activities under this include student seminars, group discussions, debates, quizzes organised as part of CIA, flip classrooms (students are expected to go through the reading materials and come prepared for a classroom discussion), exhibitions by students, student clubs and associations activities, aid in student participative learning as the activities are planned and executed by the students under the guidance of faculty members.

**Problem-Solving Methodologies:** Problem-solving methodologies are an integral part of all courses in all programmes. Along with theoretical explanations, practical knowledge is imparted to the students through practical courses like Tally, Excel, SPSS, and SAP which employ hands-on learning methods. Students are encouraged to take up Research Projects in which they need to identify a research problem and apply problem-solving techniques learnt in the classroom to the problem. Book reviews and case studies are introduced in class. Library-based assignments like open-text tests and research-based library work for students are practised.

### TEACHING PROCESSES

In addition to the above modes used for student-centric learning, teaching methods like Shared Teaching practice and the utilisation of technology through the use of LMS help students enhance their learning experience.

#### Technology in Teaching

All classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors and the teachers make effective use of them to blend audio-visual content in classroom teaching. With innovative teaching methods utilising ICT like webinars, Edmodo, MOOCs, Moodle, and Coursera, the students gain knowledge through various online educational platforms as well. The academic performance of students, attendance records, and engagement in co-curricular and sporting activities are tracked by students, parents, and the faculty using the online ERP portal.

#### Learning Management System (LMS)

Learning Management Systems (LMS) provide a platform for teachers and students to integrate various aspects of learning. Such a platform allows the students to track their learning levels and the faculty to innovate teaching strategies. The institution uses Linways software and MS Teams as its learning management system. LMS like Moodle, Google Classroom, and Edmodo are used by teachers to provide instruction, conduct tests, and supply reading materials and links to online content. Technology is used efficiently to enrich the learning experience for students.

### NATIONAL ACADEMIC DEPOSITORY (NAD)

The institution has successfully uploaded the marks of 2018, 2019 & 2020 batches. SJCC is one of first colleges in Karnataka to finish the process. The records available in the ABC portal would be available to the student for redemption of a Diploma/Certificate/Degree nationwide. 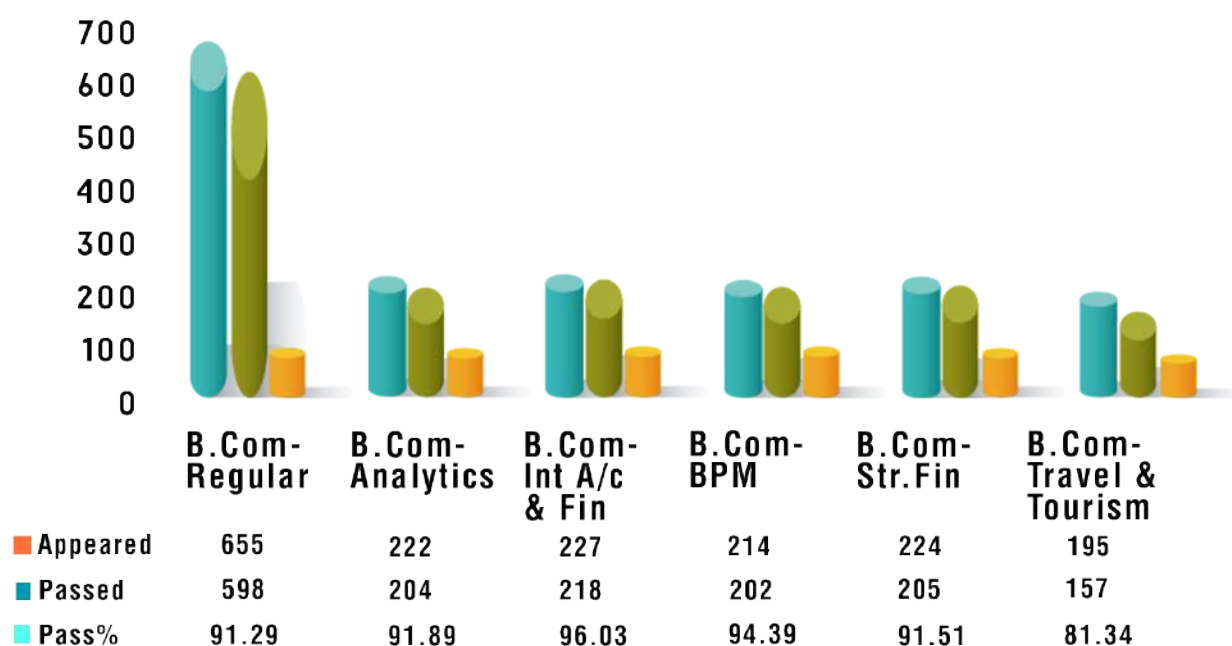

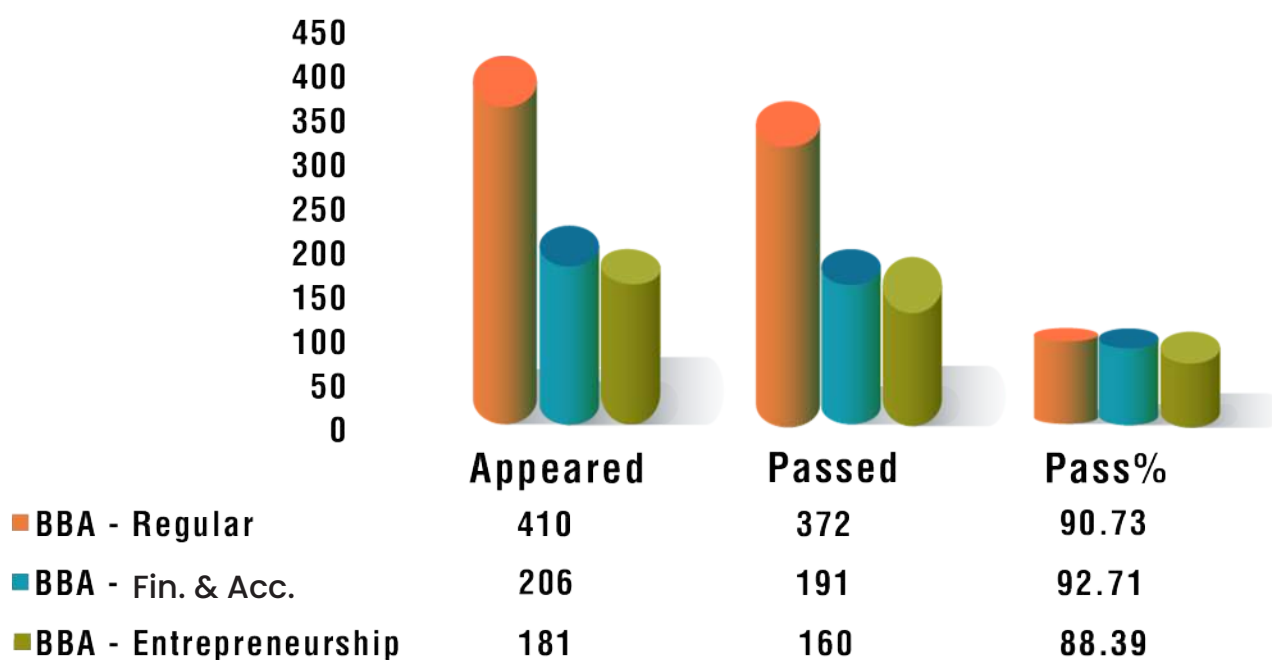

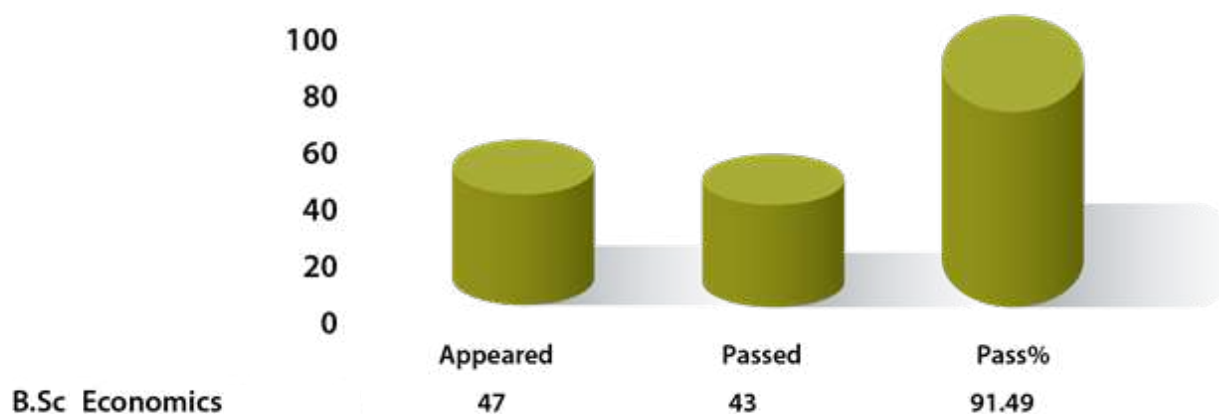
## OVERALL EVEN SEM RESULTS - B.COM MAY. 2023



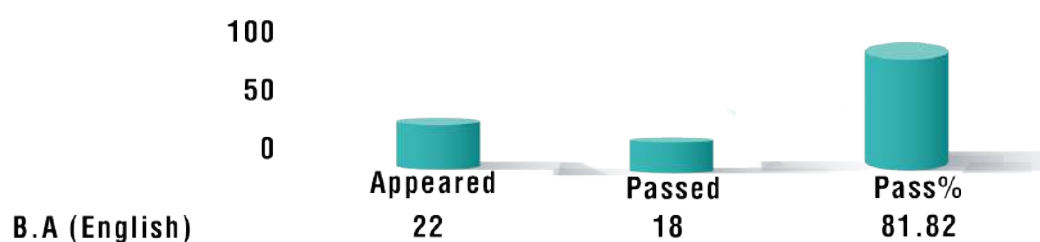
## OVERALL Even SEM RESULTS - B.B.A May 2023



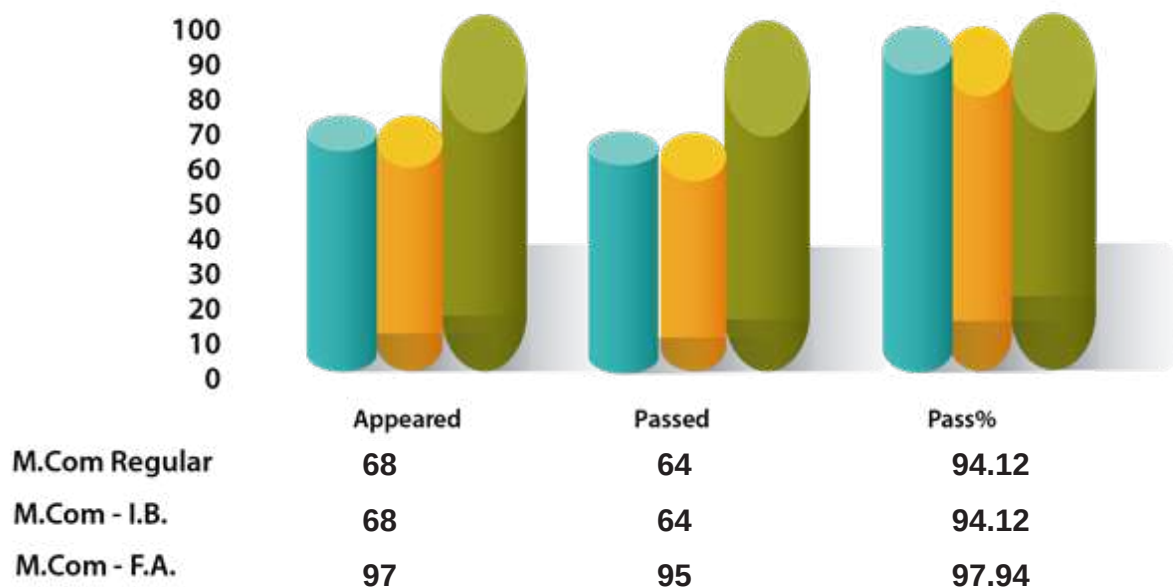
## Even Sem Results B.Sc Economics May 2023

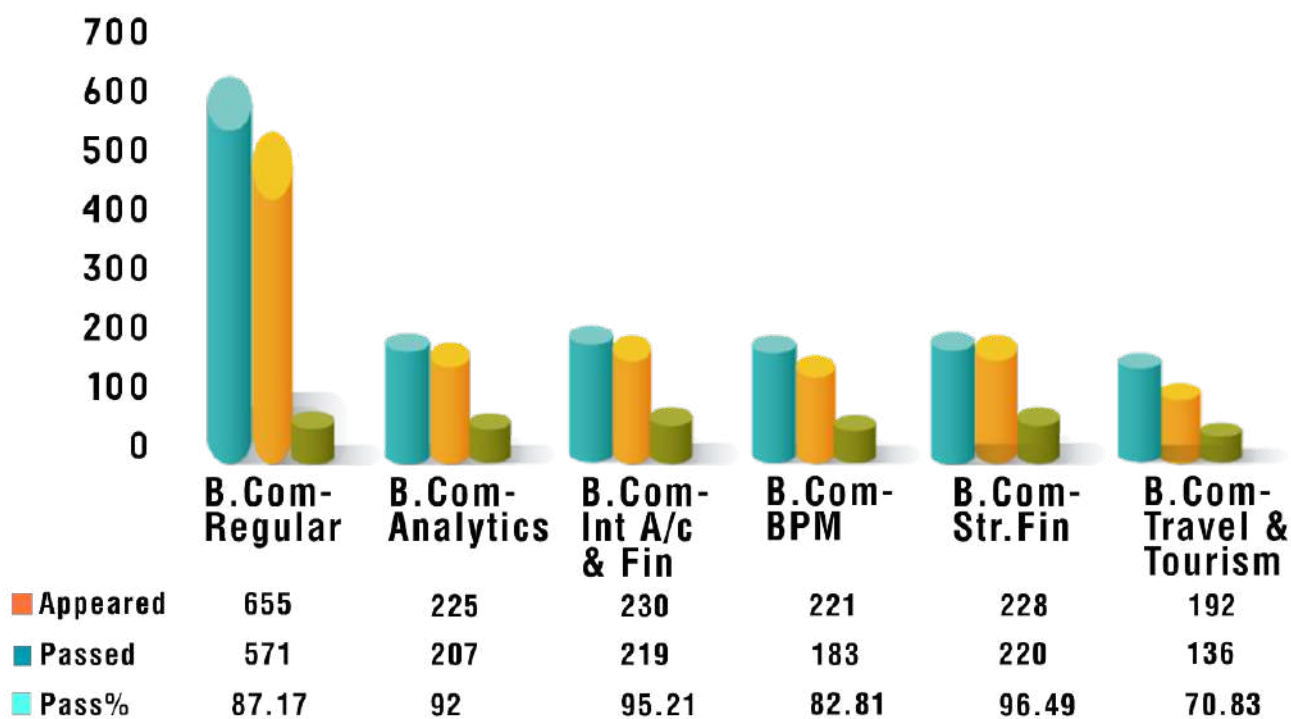

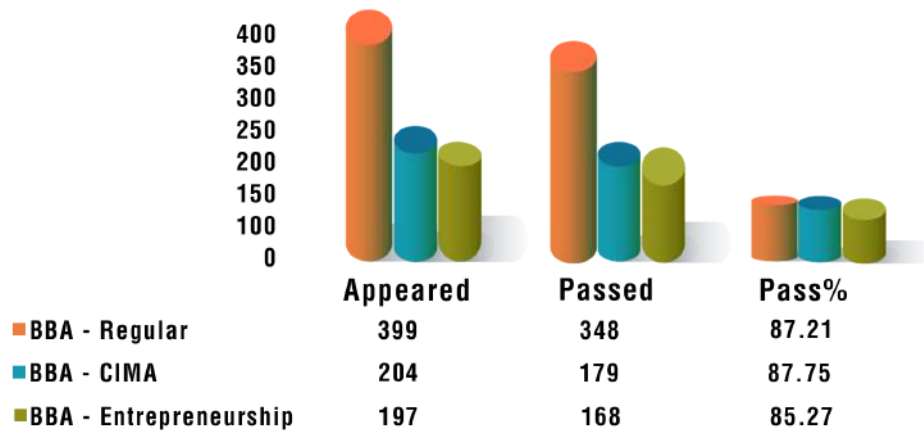

#### ANALYSIS OF I, III & V ODD SEMESTER RESULTS-OCT. 2023

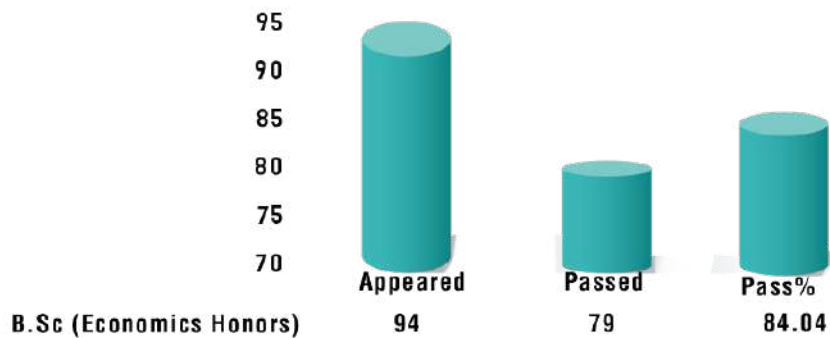
#### OVERALL ODD SEM RESULTS - B.COM OCTOBER 2023



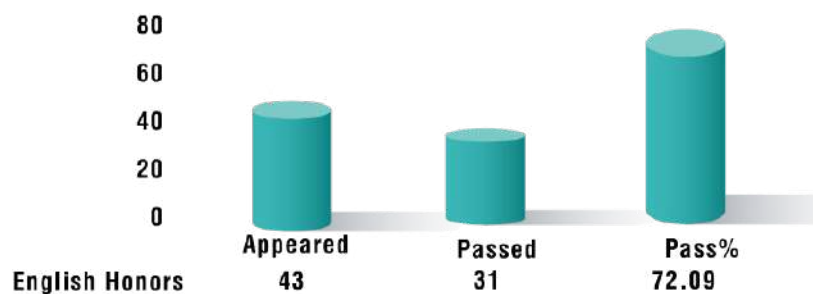
### OVERALL ODD SEM RESULTS - B.B.A OCTOBER 2023



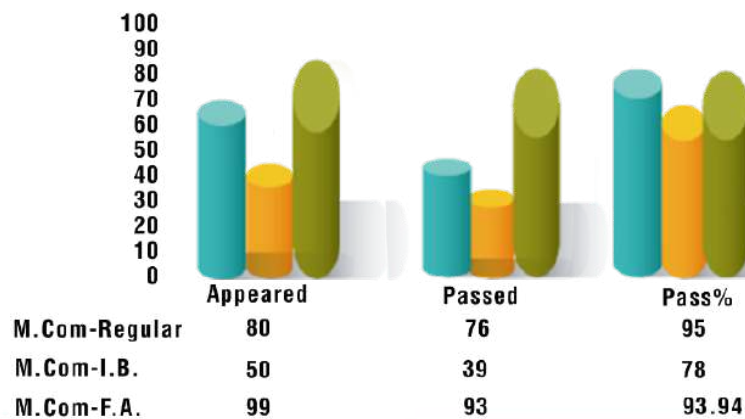
### ODD SEM RESULTS - B.Sc (Economics) Oct. 2023

## RESEARCH CULTURE

### RESEARCH AT SJCC

Research is an integral component of academic excellence at SJCC. The college has a Research Centre recognised by the Bengaluru City University, and the Centre plays a vital role in fostering research culture at the institution. The institution facilitates research in four significant parts – PhD Programme with Bangalore University (BU)/Bengaluru City University (BCU), Departmental Support for Research to Undergraduate (UG) and Postgraduate (PG) Students, BJES Seed Money Project, and Faculty (Individual/Joint) Research.

### RESEARCH SUPPORT TO UNDERGRADUATE AND POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS:

The SJCC Research Centre places significant importance on student research by actively engaging and providing support to the undergraduate departments of Commerce and Management, as well as the Department of Postgraduate Studies in Commerce. These departments have established exclusive associations to cultivate a research culture among students.

*Mainframe Research Forum*, an initiative of the Department of Commerce, aims to assist students in developing the ability to effectively engage in research. It guides them through seminars, conferences, guest lectures, workshops, and training programmes.

*The Quest Club* of the Department of Management helps students with logical reasoning and critical thinking. The activities of the club supplement the skill set of students in the field of research through seminars, conferences, guest lectures, workshops, and training programmes.

The Post Graduate Department of Commerce organizes various programmes to enhance the research skills of the students. The Centre supports by organizing experiential workshops on research methodology, training programmes, seminars, and conferences. Additionally, it assists the department in providing an elaborate platform for both departmental students and external researchers. The Centre assists the department in reviewing the synopsis submitted by the final year students as part of their Dissertation projects and ensures that quality research projects are undertaken by the students.

### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE SJCC RESEARCH CENTRE – 2023-24:

- The Centre received eight newly recognized PhD Research Supervisors in Commerce approved by the Bengaluru City University.
- The Centre revamped the research policies of the college regarding the promotion of research, the code of ethics to check malpractices and plagiarism in research, and the seed money research grant policy.
- The Centre initiated the process of starting a PhD program on campus. It invited applications from eligible research supervisors and planned meetings with advocates and research supervisors to address legal aspects related to the program. The Centre compiled and organized the bio-data of research supervisors, identified eligible ones to guide future PhD scholars, and sent an official letter seeking permission to the Registrar (Evaluation) of Bengaluru City University and the Higher Education Council for the commencement of the PhD program on campus.
- The Centre, in collaboration with Sapna Book House, organized the book launch of 'An Uncommon Love' by Sudha Murthy and Narayana Murthy, beautifully crafted by Chitra B Divakaruni, on February 10th, 2024

The journal welcomes original research articles, review articles, conceptual articles, case studies, book reviews, short comments on diverse issues, and solution-oriented findings in studies of management and business studies. A unique feature of this journal is that we also accept manuscripts communicating to a broader audience about research projects financed by national and international funding agencies.

The Institution's Innovation Cell (IIC) at St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) initially operated under the name of the Innovation and Incubation Centre since 2017. The IIC at SJCC, a registered cell (Registration no. IC202115549) with the Ministry of Education, Government of India, aims to systematically foster a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship among the faculty and students of the college. The primary mandate of the cell is to encourage, inspire, and nurture young students by supporting them to work with new ideas and transform them into prototypes during their formative years. The cell establishes networks with various IICs and entrepreneurial bodies across the country to promote innovation through diverse modes, leading to an innovative ecosystem on the campuses.

The IIC is registered under the National Innovation Start-up Policy (NISP) and the YUKTI Portal, Ministry of Education, GOI.

### ACTIVITIES OF IIC

#### 1. Introduction to IIC

Seizing the opportune moment, the Institution's Innovation Cell (IIC) stepped into the limelight, introducing its multifaceted role to the eager audience. ## Participation and Structure

The format comprised two rounds, each exploring real-life cases within the realm of Intellectual Property Rights. In the first round, participants presented stances on cases such as Yash Raj Films vs Sri Sai Ganesh Productions and Novartis vs Union of India, providing a practical and nuanced perspective. The second round confronted participants with the ethical question of using pirated content for academic purposes, introducing a layer of complexity and ethical consideration to the debate. This challenged participants to navigate the delicate balance between academic needs and copyright ethics.

### 4. Networking & Bonding Event - Collaboration '24

On January 16, 2024, St. Joseph's College of Commerce hosted a collaborative event titled "Networking & Bonding Event - Collaboration '24." This synergistic effort, orchestrated by the Institutions Innovation Cell (IIC), BCom Newsroom, and TechAlly, was specifically designed to foster inter-association collaboration and enhance student engagement.

### 5. Invictus 2024

On February 7, 2024, the Institutions Innovation Cell hosted its flagship event, "Invictus-2024," an intercollegiate business plan event. This event aimed to provide a platform for aspiring entrepreneurs and established businesses to showcase their innovative ideas, compete for prizes, and engage with a diverse audience. The highlight of Invictus was the business plan competition, emphasizing entrepreneurship, creativity, and talent in the business world. Participants were tasked with pitching their business plans eloquently, demonstrating thorough market research, financial projections, and unique selling propositions.

### 6. Digimania 24

DigiMania was an online poster-making competition conducted on the Unstop platform, inviting individual participation from colleges across India. Participants were tasked with creating digital posters based on the theme "Start-Up Sparks," aiming to illustrate the journey of a startup from idea generation to scaling up.

### 7. Participation

Ten students of IIC actively participated in Global Voices and Insights Business Growth Summit organized by Maximize U. The co-founders of Maximize U shared their entrepreneurial journeys to motivate the students. Sessions covered diverse topics, including project-based learning, voice modulation for social skills enhancement, high-income skills importance, leveraging personalities in deals, impact creation in business propositions, HR success strategies, and turning breakdowns into breakthroughs. The summit concluded with a panel discussion allowing attendees to

pitch ideas. Additionally, an online session titled "Introduction to GenAI" by the Ministry of Education involved students from the social media and innovation wings, led by Mr. Sachin Punyani from Amazon Web Services. The session explored AI technologies, their applications in problem-solving and decision-making, and emerging research in genetic algorithms and AI models.

### 8. Mentoring

The Incubation wing of the cell actively assisted students by providing guidance on ideation and progress for their business ventures. Three students underwent multiple mentor sessions, resulting in one student developing an app for their business venture. They are currently in contact with OSA members seeking seed funding to launch the app to the masses.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

### Government Scholarship

To provide necessary encouragement and motivation to pursue Higher Education, the Government of Karnataka and the Central Government provide various scholarship schemes to meritorious and economically backward students. At SJCC students are sent notifications of the scholarships and encouraged to apply for these scholarships. The college has also deputed a faculty-in-charge to channelise the scholarships and fellowships offered by the UGC. In the current academic year, the students of the college have received Rs. 1,57,920/- under the various Government scholarship schemes.

## Management Scholarship

The management awards scholarships to meritorious students coming from economically weaker sections of society. The Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES) has set up the Management Scholarship Fund. The college has set up a Management Scholarship Committee to recognise needy, meritorious and deserving students in academics, sports and co-curricular activities. The scholarship applications are screened and the beneficiaries are selected based on set criteria of selection. In the current year Rs. 1,35,00,000/- worth of scholarships were disbursed to deserving students.

## OSA Scholarship

The Alumni of the college have a fund and the income generated from the fund is used to grant scholarships annually to students from economically weaker sections of the society. The alumni have formed a committee which independently scrutinizes the applicants and holds interviews with their parents to determine genuine beneficiaries. During the current academic year, Rs. 25,25,000/- worth of scholarships was granted to the students from the alumni scholarship fund.

- Health & well-being support - For physical and mental health and the overall well-being of the student
- Women's Forum – an association to educate, empower and ensure an encouraging space for women that promotes meaningful discussions
- Class Ladies Representatives – To ensure representation of girl students and also to establish a formal contact point for girl students to express their concerns
- Women Empowerment Programmes - To empower girl students through talks, workshops and campaigns
- Safety & Surveillance - CCTV cameras installed to deter unruly behaviour and ensure the safety of women on campus
- Women Counsellors – personal and social counselling, specifically by lady counsellors to listen to the concerns of girl students
- Representation of Women in Student Council – the institution ensures equal gender representation in leadership positions
- Exclusive Open House for Women – IQAC organises Open House to listen to and address the concerns of girl students.

### Events conducted

- **Talk on Menstrual Health:** Conducting a talk on menstrual health helped in promoting awareness, addressing taboos, and providing essential information. It empowers individuals to manage their health effectively, fosters a supportive community, and contributes to overall well-being.
- **Documentary Screening on Human Trafficking:** The selected documentary for that occasion was 'Fatima' as it educated students and the community, encouraged activism, and fostered empathy. It empowered individuals to act against human rights violations and advocate for change in the future. After the screening there was a panel discussion which helped students clear their doubts and be part of an insightful discussion.
- **Guest lecture on Leadership and Resilience:** The forum organised a guest lecture by Ms. Anala Padmanabha, Senior Consultant at McKinsey & Company which revolved around leadership and how one can withstand the competition in the corporate world. The speaker also discussed various ways in which young female students can empower themselves with the opportunities ahead of them. The



event ended with an evolved perspective of corporate and it also motivated the students to pursue their passion and aim for something they love.

- **Eve's Week:** In commemoration of the International Women's Day, the Women's Forum organised activities from 3rd March to 7th March 2024. Activities revolved around fostering sisterhood, belongingness and love for one another. Eve's Day was celebrated on the 7th of March 2024, drawing a beautiful end and instilling the theme 'realm of sisterhood' among the students.

In addition to the above-stated initiatives, the college ensures that female faculty members accompany students on every off-campus camp, study tour and other academic activity. The college strives to build healthy spaces that promote the harmonious coexistence of students irrespective of their gender and other backgrounds.

## **MENTORSHIP**

Mentoring works as a support system for students and provides comfort. Every first-year class gets two mentors to mentor 40 students each. The mentors arrange meetings with students individually and help them address their concerns. Mentors keep track of academic performance, leave records and meet parents whenever required. In addition, they educate students about the college rules and facilities that they can avail of. Class mentors maintain student files which contains students' details and it is updated from time to time. This file is passed on to the mentors of the subsequent years of the programme.

## **COUNSELLING CELL**

The college has three full-time counsellors and one part-time counsellor, who play a vital role in character formation which is one of the core objectives of the institution. The counsellors are active members of various cells and committees in college and undertake other responsibilities as and when required. The counsellors are also active members of the student grievance and sexual harassment cell, offering support to students and parents when the need arises.

### **Personal Counselling**

Students take appointments with the counsellor for one-on-one personal counselling sessions and work closely on overcoming their problems. Students come with issues related to peer pressure, transition into college life, adjustment issues, emotional issues like fear, anger, grief, and anxiety, academic issues like performance, attendance and inappropriate behaviour, low self-esteem, trauma and other psychological distress.

### **Group Counselling**

The counsellors meet the students in groups of 5-6 as part of the outreach program organized by BEMBALA. These sessions provide them with a space for self-discovery by learning from each other, recognising and embracing their strengths and

capabilities and accepting their shortcomings. This also gives the counsellors a chance to build rapport with the students and create awareness about the counselling process and various concerns that students at their age may have. Group sessions are conducted in the first year for UG and PG students.

### **Student Support Services**

In addition, class mentors and teachers refer students to counsellors when they feel that the student requires emotional support. Counsellors also recommend teachers to give special attention to students who require help. Family members are also met by the counsellors when the need arises.

The counselling team has also extended their services to students in times of emergencies when they have been taken to the hospital from college, to provide strength and support.

### **Psychological Well-Being Programme**

As part of their curriculum, all the first-year students have a mandatory course on Psychological Well-Being during their first semester which is a 2-credit paper. These sessions were designed to help students become more aware of themselves, and others around them, using a lot of reflective activities and exercises- individual and group.

The department developed a course plan for the same with five modules based on the PERMA model. This included topics on Positive Emotions, Relationships, Meaning of life, goal setting and Achievement. The classes were divided into twelve sessions and it was conducted through various activities, skill-building and reflective exercises. Approximately 1000 students attended the classes. Students were assessed through various skill-based activities and reflections throughout the semester. These sessions were designed to help students become more aware of themselves, and others around them, using a lot of activities.

### **SAMAGRA (St. Joseph's Holistic Wellness Center)**

The counsellors at SJCC have been actively involved in the activities of SAMAGRA. Counsellors regularly attend monthly meetings at the Samagra offices. During these meetings and discussions, various concerns have been raised and discussed to improve the quality of mental health services provided at SJCC. These discussions have been highly insightful with case presentations, book reviews and group interactions. The SJCC team has helped build resources for the SAMAGRA website by contributing psychoeducational videos, blogs and articles.

### **Awareness Initiatives**

On June 26, 2023, St. Joseph's College of Commerce, in association with Cubbon Park Police, hosted an awareness program on Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. This initiative, aligned with the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, aimed to raise awareness of the societal impact of illicit drugs.

### **PARENT-TEACHER MEETING**

The institution prioritises interaction with parents to augment the holistic development of students. The Parent-Teacher Meeting conducted annually provides the parents a platform to address their concerns and issues regarding their wards. Such interaction also allows the teachers to know their students better. It, therefore, works together with the parents of the students to ensure that the education of their wards is in line with their expectations. Parent-teacher meetings allow the institution to understand the concerns of the parents and address them, while also helping them understand the ethos of the college. Their support is an integral part of the educational mission of the college and thus, such interaction provides a better understanding of the stakeholders' views.

#### **1st year UG PTM**

The first-year parent-teacher meeting for the academic year 2023-24 was conducted both Offline and Online, based on parental residence. The meeting took place on Saturday, 16th September 2023, at the college premises. Online sessions were held from Monday, 18th September 2023, to Saturday, 23rd September 2023, using platforms like MS Teams, Google, or Skype. For parents without access to these platforms, telephonic calls were utilized. The meeting aimed to discuss students' marks, attendance, and behavior, providing parents insight into their wards' progress at SJCC. Feedback was collected and submitted to IQAC for analysis.

#### **2nd and 3rd year UG PTM**

PTM for 2nd & 3rd Years (Shift 1 & 2) for the academic year 2023-24 took place from Monday 18th to Saturday 30th September 2023. Attendance shortages and marks were communicated via email on 16th September 2023. Students were subsequently called to campus as per class mentors' availability, with concerns also related to parents in person. Consent forms were collected, and for parents unable to meet mentors, attendance, midterm exam marks, and backlogs were communicated via call or online meeting.

## TRAINING AND PLACEMENT

The College maintains its exemplary reputation by creating industry-ready and competent individuals who get placed through the placement activities organised by the College Placements Cell. The College has a faculty-in-charge who is the Placements Officer on the campus and plays a seminal role in connecting the students to the industry. Over the years, the students of the college have been placed in prestigious and renowned industries.

### PRE-PLACEMENT PROCESS AND SKILL DEVELOPMENT:

Pre-Placement Process and Skill Development comprises of activities to prepare the pre-final/final year students of the institution for the placement opportunities in their outgoing year. Activities ranging from career mapping, career guidance, and workshops on aptitude, soft skills, and technical skills to excel in interviews are organized for students.

The industry academia interface is another focal area for the cell, through which it has courses, seminars, and guest talks in collaboration with companies during the academic year. Second-year students take up corporate internships to help them an easy transition into the final recruitment process.

The placement Process followed at the institution is divided into three different phases for the smooth functioning of the placement activities.

Phase one includes a briefing on the college placement policy/code of conduct for students, a pre-placement workshop, a series of guest talks, and career mapping sessions.

Phase two includes registration by students interested in campus placement and the The final phase is when we have the companies visiting the institution to conduct an on-campus recruitment drive.

### PLACEMENT ORIENTATION

Placement orientations were conducted for UG and PG Students. More than 400 students were interested in taking part in placement drives for the academic year 2023-24. From BCOM / BBA & MCOM.

### PRE-PLACEMENT PROCESS AND SKILL DEVELOPMENT OUTLINE

Career Recruitment Training (CRT) is organized by SJCC in association with Disciples India Group with A two-week Employability Training Workshop to fine-tune the skills of students to make them industry-ready. CRT Prep conducted this workshop for the final year students from 10<sup>th</sup> July 2023 to 30<sup>th</sup> July 2023. Spread over a period of two weeks, this workshop included quantitative modules, logical reasoning, resume building, mock interviews, and soft skills development sessions. Personal Interview. The recruitment exercise commenced in college as early as the last week of June 2023. The organizations offered diverse roles varying from finance, accounts, marketing, and human resources, to name a few. Information about placements was made available to students through the college ERP & SMS system, E-Mails, social media platforms, and placement notice board. For this academic year, 478 Undergraduate & Postgraduate students registered for campus placements (who are eligible for placement activities) of which 190 students have been offered jobs by various companies, and many more are in the pipeline for recruitment and selection.

### INTERNSHIP REPORT OF THE UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

Internship is mandated by the National Education Policy-2020 and is a compulsory part of the curricular aspects to facilitate the integration of theoretical learning through application and practice at the workplace. The Placement Cell assists students to pursue internships in corporate offices, industries, and non-profit organisations to connect and apply the concepts learnt in the classroom. Three distinctive internship programmes are conducted by the Placements Cell at the campus:

- a) **Corporate Internships:** Corporate internships are mandatory for 2nd-year B. Com and BBA students, offering practical industry exposure alongside classroom studies. It aims at enabling the students to get practical exposure to different functions of the industry that further supplements classroom learning with practical experience. Students must complete a 4-to-6-week internship before their fifth semester, submitting a report evaluated through a viva-voce for credits. These credits are awarded in the sixth semester. In the 2023-24 academic year, approximately 915 students from the 2021 batch undertook internships between June and August 2023, both online and offline, across India and abroad.

## Internship Recruitment for Pre-Final Year Students 2023-24

During the odd semester of 2023-24, the Placements & Internship Cell arranged recruitment sessions for different organizations visiting the campus. These sessions aimed to select students for part-time corporate internships or internships feasible for the upcoming summer of the Academic Year 2024-25.

**b. Social Internship:** The Social Internship is an integral component of the curriculum, fostering a sense of social responsibility among students. In 2022, a group of 568 B. Com students engaged in Social Internships, dedicating 60 hours during their second year of study. These internships were completed prior to the start of their fourth semester, in January 2023. Following the internships, students submitted reports which were then evaluated through viva voce examinations. Credits for their participation were subsequently allocated to the relevant department.

**c. Start-Up Internship:** Internships tailored for the BBA (Entrepreneurship) program are meticulously crafted to blend hands-on learning and top-notch education with a global perspective in mind. This specialized curriculum integrates a vibrant mix of creativity, innovation, critical analysis, and organizational skills, delivered through an engaging and interactive platform aimed at nurturing students into adept entrepreneurs of tomorrow. A total of 69 second-semester BBA (Entrepreneurship) students engaged in offline internships at startup ventures for a duration spanning 4 to 6 weeks, occurring during the semester break preceding their third semester. Following their internships, students compiled and submitted detailed reports, subsequently undergoing viva voce examinations. The credits earned from these examinations were duly shared with the department for proper allocation.

## LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SERVICES

### LIBRARY AS A LEARNING RESOURCE

The library is fully automated for its in-house day-to-day activities using EASYLIB Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS). The automated modules include cataloguing and accessing, acquisition, serial control (periodicals control), member module, circulation, and in-out management. Additionally, there is a Web-OPAC available for searching the library's holdings.

Every year, the library at St. Joseph's College of Commerce makes an intensive effort to add both electronic and print resources to its collection. The library currently holds a collection of 32,869 print books on various branches of commerce, management, mathematics, statistics, languages, personality development, competitive exams, general books, ACCA, CIMA, CA, and CPT that are well-balanced and comprehensive. In addition, the library contains numerous useful reference books, back issues of periodicals, VCDs, DVDs, ACDs, Kindles, and CD-ROMs. In addition to print resources and maintaining user convenience and 24/7 access, the SJCC library currently holds 79948 e-books and 12000+ e-journals.

The library organises annual orientation programmes for new students and provides hands-on training on specific digital resources to improve their ability to retrieve information. Knimbus, a remote access platform, provided digital academic resources to faculty, research scholars, and students. This platform allowed them to access subscribed digital resources using a single username and password, thereby improving the utilisation of these resources.

## INFRASTRUCTURE AND IT REFORMS

The college has a policy in place for maintaining and upgrading its physical infrastructure and IT facilities. The institution upgrades its IT facilities on a regular basis

### PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

- Light roofing infrastructure has been added to the building to reduce the weight and increase energy efficiency.
- The construction of the Boys Hostel is finished, comprising of 90 rooms that can provide lodging to 180 students.
- Installation of RO water plants on every floor.
- Remodeling of canteen premises to maintain accessibility and hygiene.
- New staircase for emergency exit attached to each floor.
- Renovation of board room and conference rooms.

### IT REFORMS

The college has upgraded the following IT facilities:

The St. Ignatius Feast Celebrations held at St. Joseph's College of Commerce was a grand success, bringing together students from various disciplines to commemorate the founding father of the college, St. Ignatius of Loyola. In the light of the feast of St. Ignatius, several events such as Poster Making, Costume Presentation, Caption Writing, Quiz and Reel It, were conducted for the students between 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2023 to 28<sup>th</sup> July, 2023. The event aimed to foster a sense of unity, creativity, and learning among students through a series of exciting and engaging activities.

### BEMBALA OUTREACH ACTIVITIES 2023 - 2024

#### Independence Day celebration

##### *SDG 16 - Peace, Justice, and strong institutions*

The first year M. Com Regular and FA students visited Moulana Azad School and Bosco Mane School respectively, to celebrate Independence Day. The visit featured a diverse range of activities, games, and a cultural program, all geared towards engaging and educating the children in an enjoyable manner.

#### Home of Hope Visit

##### *SDG 1 – No Poverty; SDG 2 – Zero Hunger; SDG 3 – Good Health and Well-being*

Both 1 M. Com IB and 2 M. Com IB headed to ‘Home of Hope’ a destitute house as part of their Regular and special activity completion. The students learned a lot from their visit to Home of Hope and stated that, “Our faith was restored in humanity”.

#### Regular Activities for UG Classes (950 students)

B. Com A, B, C, D, E, F, H (560 students), BBA A, B, C, D (300 students), BA English (30 students) and B.Sc. Eco (60 students) had their activities conducted for 5 days. Every class was divided into 5 groups. Each group had 15 students and they were sent for the following activities:

#### Traffic Awareness

Around the vicinity of the college at Brigade Road, SJPU, and Show off Signals, students displayed placards and positioned themselves near the traffic lights to promote awareness about traffic regulations.

## **Government School Visit**

To enhance the inclusiveness among the student community, students visited the Maulana Azad school to promote and create a fun learning experience among school children. The activities conducted here fostered a sense of responsibility and imparted valuable knowledge to shape the young minds in order for them to become responsible adults.

## **Paper Cover Making & Distribution**

To raise awareness about utilizing paper bags instead of plastic covers, students were taught how to make paper covers, and distributed them to nearby hawkers while spreading awareness about the environmental benefits of paper bags over plastic ones. This activity emphasized the importance of sustainability and responsible consumer choices and gave the students a sense of satisfaction for contributing to creating an eco-friendly environment.

## **Counselling**

They briefed the students about the session and addressed the importance of mental health, the idea behind counselling and how it works. The survey conducted helped students to know whether people in and around Sindagi are availing various government facilities and if the children are going to school or not. The field work enabled the students to know the hardships of the villagers. The students also visited an anganwadi and taught the children about English, Science, hygiene and keeping the surroundings clean.

#### **M.Com FA visit to Manvi**

The class was taken to Manvi for their rural exposure camp. The class went for a cleanliness drive to the Daddal Pannur village to spread awareness on keeping the surroundings clean and on how to avoid and keep illnesses at bay. They also took part in an 'Environmental March' to strengthen the motive to keep the environment clean along with sapling plantation in the same village.

### **UG Rural Exposure Camp to Solur / Nelamangala (1,030 students)**

The second-year classes which visited and engaged in activities for the Rural Exposure Camp were: 2 B. Com A, B, C, D, E, F, G and H (640 students), 2 BBA A, B, C and D (300 students), BA English (30 students) and B. Sc Eco (60 students). The activities conducted during the camp visit were Fieldwork, Brick factory visits, village visits, a cultural programme and plantation drives.

Participating in agricultural tasks during the field work was a true eye opener. It allowed them to experience the hard work and dedication that goes into sustaining a livelihood through farming. ## STUDENT COUNCIL REPORT

The college administration emphasizes the importance of student involvement in the academic decision-making processes to enhance institutional progress. To facilitate this, students are actively engaged in college affairs across various levels and are integral to the decision-making process.

Citizenship training is an integral part of education at this institution. As part of the citizenship training, the college has instituted a Student Council which is elected directly by students. The Student Council comprises President, Vice-president, Treasurer, General Secretary, Academic Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Sports Secretary and Ladies Secretary. There is a clear division of responsibilities among the members of the Student Council with the President as the head. A faculty member is appointed as the Student Governor who will facilitate the activities of the Student Council.

The responsibility of the Student Council is to represent the concerns of the students, organize cultural, academic and sports programme for the students. The council also takes the initiative in organizing programmes and activities directed towards the welfare of the student community.

Additionally, they spearhead initiatives aimed at enhancing student welfare. An extended Students' Council includes various student representatives such as Department Coordinators, Association Coordinators, College team heads, IQAC coordinators, and Academic, Cultural, Sports and Women representatives of each class in the college. This body facilitates communication among students and provides leadership opportunities. The Student Quality Assurance Cell (SQAC), a component of the IQAC, focuses on improving overall college performance. Student representatives from each class are involved in SQAC activities to ensure excellence at the classroom level.

- Equal Opportunity Cell - A student coordinator is nominated to the Equal Opportunity Cell, whose responsibility is to work with the staff coordinator in realizing the objectives of the cell.
- Women's Forum- The Women's Forum of the college is headed by the Women Secretaries along with two staff coordinators. They organize programmes and activities in sensitizing students about gender. The forum provides a space for girl students to voice out their concerns.

## **Student Open House**

An important way in which students become part of the management of the institution is, through the Open House conducted for the students. Two Open Houses are conducted every year: a general one and one specifically for girl students. The suggestions and concerns voiced by the students are considered by the IQAC and an action plan is created.

## **Annual Elections**

Student Elections are vital for empowering students, encouraging open dialogue, and enriching the overall development of a student's life and here at SJCC, it was an amazing week filled with fun, cheer and camaraderie. ### All India Catholic Union Federation (AICUF)

- AICUF organized an **Ice Breaker session** for new community members on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2023, to foster new connections and endorse team building through multiple activities to provide an insight into the scope and objectives of the association through an orientation.
- **Christmas Celebrations and Charity Drive** was organized on 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> December 2023 to instil the spirit of Christmas by donating alms to the underprivileged while endorsing the spirit of community building.
- The annual outreach programme of AICUF was held on 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2024. The **Rural outreach** was held in **Harihar**. The event created awareness about Women trafficking happening in small towns and villages set against the shadows of a system reluctant to change.

### Debating Society

The event aimed at promoting inclusivity and skill development within the debating community. The event featured four distinct events – Talk of Titans (Debate), Facts vs Fabrication (Journalism), Devil's Advocate, and Kannada debate.

#### E-Cell

### Teacher's Day

Teachers Day was celebrated in the college on the 5<sup>th</sup> of September 2023. The OSA didn't want to let thanked the teachers for all that they do through the conduct of the event. The young energetic committee went out of its way to decorate the hall in college and organized various games which were well appreciated. A sumptuous lunch catered by one of our very own Alumni followed. A takeaway gift and a plant were given to all staff.

### OSA Scholarships

There are three types of scholarships awarded by the OSA.

- **Scholarships to the College:**

For the 1<sup>st</sup> year 54 applications were received. For the 2<sup>nd</sup> year 68 applications were received and for the third year 63 applications were received. Therefore, a total of 185 applications were received and shortlisted as well. 175 students were interviewed and a total of 166 students were awarded the scholarship. The total amount awarded in lakhs was 6.85 for the 1<sup>st</sup> year, 9.65 for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year and 8.75 for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year. Hence, a total of Rs. 25.25 lakhs were awarded.

- **Multi Batch Scholarships**

A few Alumni from SJCC have come forward and committed to contribute a sum of money every year to take care of the education of 50 students from PUC to Degree. This was started last year and continued this year as well. 130 applications were received for I PUC Day, 16 applications were received for I PUC Evening, 94 applications were received for II PUC Day and 24 applications were received for II PUC Evening. Therefore, a total of 264 applications were received. 73 applicants for I PUC Day, 10 applicants for I PUC Evening, 74 applicants for II PUC Day and 4 applicants for II PUC Evening attended the interview, making it a total of 161 interviewees. Scholarships were awarded to 57 for I PUC Day, 10 for I PUC Evening, 43 for II PUC Day and 4 for II PUC Evening. Hence, a total of 114 scholarships were awarded. Rs. 13.76 lakhs were awarded to I PUC Day scholars, Rs. 94,000 was awarded to I PUC Evening scholars, Rs. 9 lakhs were awarded to II PUC Day scholars and Rs. 35,000 was awarded to II PUC Evening scholars. A total of Rs. 24.05 lakhs were awarded.

The OSA has identified 114 students who have been paid 40% of their college fees. These students will be helped right through their college education.

### **Scholarships to Bhavana Jyothi students**

BJES have identified poor students from areas near the college. One Alumni has offered to sponsor 5 students from this scheme and pay Rs. 1.50 lakhs every year to cover the tuition fees for a year.

### **Rolling Trophy and Cash Prize for Winning Class in KALOTSAV**

The alumni presented a Rolling trophy for the Best Class at Kalotsav, they also provided a Cash Prize of Rs. 10,000/-for the winners of the fest. This initiative saw great participation and enthusiasm among the students.

### **Advance Course for GST**

Based on the good response received with the Skills Development Course conducted in the previous year, the Alumni conducted an advance course on GST for the students pursuing 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year of their course. 32 students attended and completed the course, certificates were awarded for the same.

### **Bikers Ride**

The Alumni has a Bikers Club where Bikers go for a ride every quarter. This year there were two rides that were conducted. On the 13<sup>th</sup> of November a ride to cover 180 kms was conducted. Around 32 members participated. On 19<sup>th</sup> February a bike ride was conducted with 29 members covering a stretch of 200 kms.

### ANIMUM '23

As part of the golden jubilee celebrations and keeping in mind the core objective of character formation, the counselling cell conceptualized a national-level short film festival in 2023 and conducted the second edition of the same on the 7<sup>th</sup> of October 2023.

The theme for the film festival was '*My Mental Health, My Right*'. This festival saw an overwhelming response with participants from different parts of the country. The event also saw eminent personalities as part of the jury and dignitaries. The festival aimed to spread mental health awareness and generate some good quality

short films on mental health. The festival successfully compiled an album of short films on various mental health concerns.

### ANNUAL REPUBLIC DAY LECTURE

The Annual Republic Day Lecture by the Department of English was conducted on 25<sup>th</sup> January 2024. This was the 6<sup>th</sup> edition of the same. The lecture was delivered by Dr. Parakala Prabhakar. Dr. Prabhakar, an alumnus of JNU and the London School of Economics, is the MD of RightFOLIO, a knowledge enterprise based in Hyderabad. He is also a widely read columnist on current affairs and has a popular YouTube channel, 'Midweek Matters', where he discusses issues related to India's politics, economy, and contemporary society. The topic in discussion this year was, '*Rescuing the Republic: The Future of Democracy in India*'. The Republic Day Lecture Series was designed to ensure a safe space for individuals to interact on ideas such as participation in democracy, pluralism and to facilitate interaction between students, public and academia. The series focuses mainly on contemporary socio-political and cultural challenges faced by the Indian Republic in today's context.

At the start of the lecture, Dr. Prabhakar discussed the major challenges we, as a Republic, are facing today. These challenges range from majoritarianism, communal disharmony, religious fundamentalism, social and economic disparities and injustices. Through his lecture he was able to point out various instances in which our government, our public institutions and most importantly how our leaders have strayed away from the ideals of our Republic.

Dr. Prabhakar also commented on the importance of education and how liberal classrooms are important in this fight against the Republic we currently live in. The session concluded with a brief Question and Answer session. His book, "*The Crooked Timber of New India*" was also available for purchase at the venue.

This session was of utmost importance to all the attendees because what it truly did was show us a mirror of the society we live in. It truly made us realize that it is pertinent for the current generation to be aware about the situation and fight against this in all ways possible.

As Dr. Prabhakar says in his book, it is important to remember that - "Essentially, nothing straight can ever be made out of crooked timber."

### BEMBALA OUTREACH PROGRAMME

As the name of the programme BEMBALA suggests, it aims to reach out to the deprived groups and vulnerable sections of society and create opportunities for education, awareness and skill enhancement. It intends to create a learning process



for faculty and students, through exposure to community needs, problems, and issues. It hopes to reach out to the community by designing need-based interventions and generating research. Eventually, it will facilitate networking and linkages of the community with NGOs, institutions, and government agencies for the effective service delivery and advocacy support. It also hopes to link up with the corporate sector within the parameters of Corporate Social Responsibilities (CSR).

A medical team of 6 doctors and medical support staff/paramedics from St. Martha's Hospital, Bangalore engaged in the day-long program. A CSP activity of SJCC is aimed to bring awareness on the general health among the migrant workers from North Karnataka, migrating for work to different areas of Bangalore city. 250 migrant workers attended the medical camp. Migrant workers were provided with lunch, refreshments, and medicines. A small gift was also given to the people. The student volunteers gathered detailed information of the migrants which would further help in conducting research on the migrant studies.
