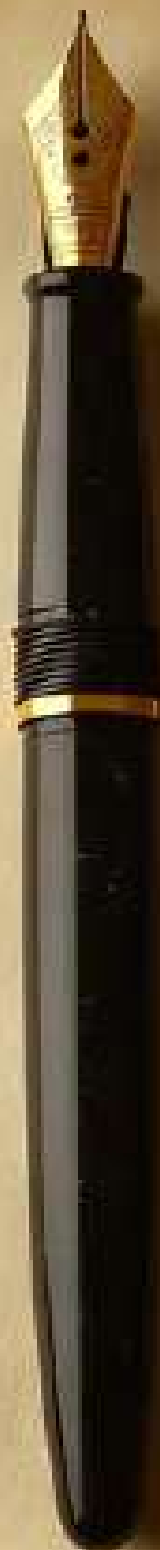
### Echoes of Resilience

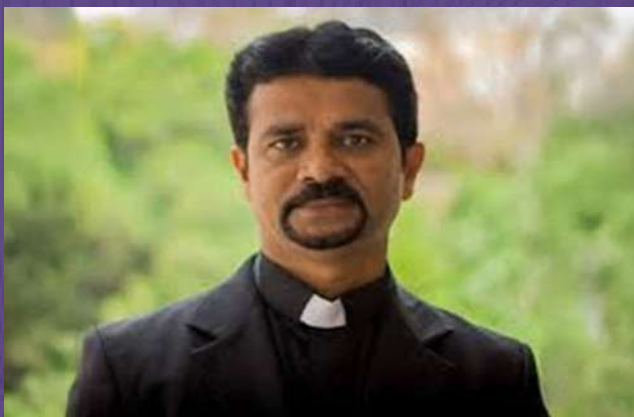


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## Rector's Message

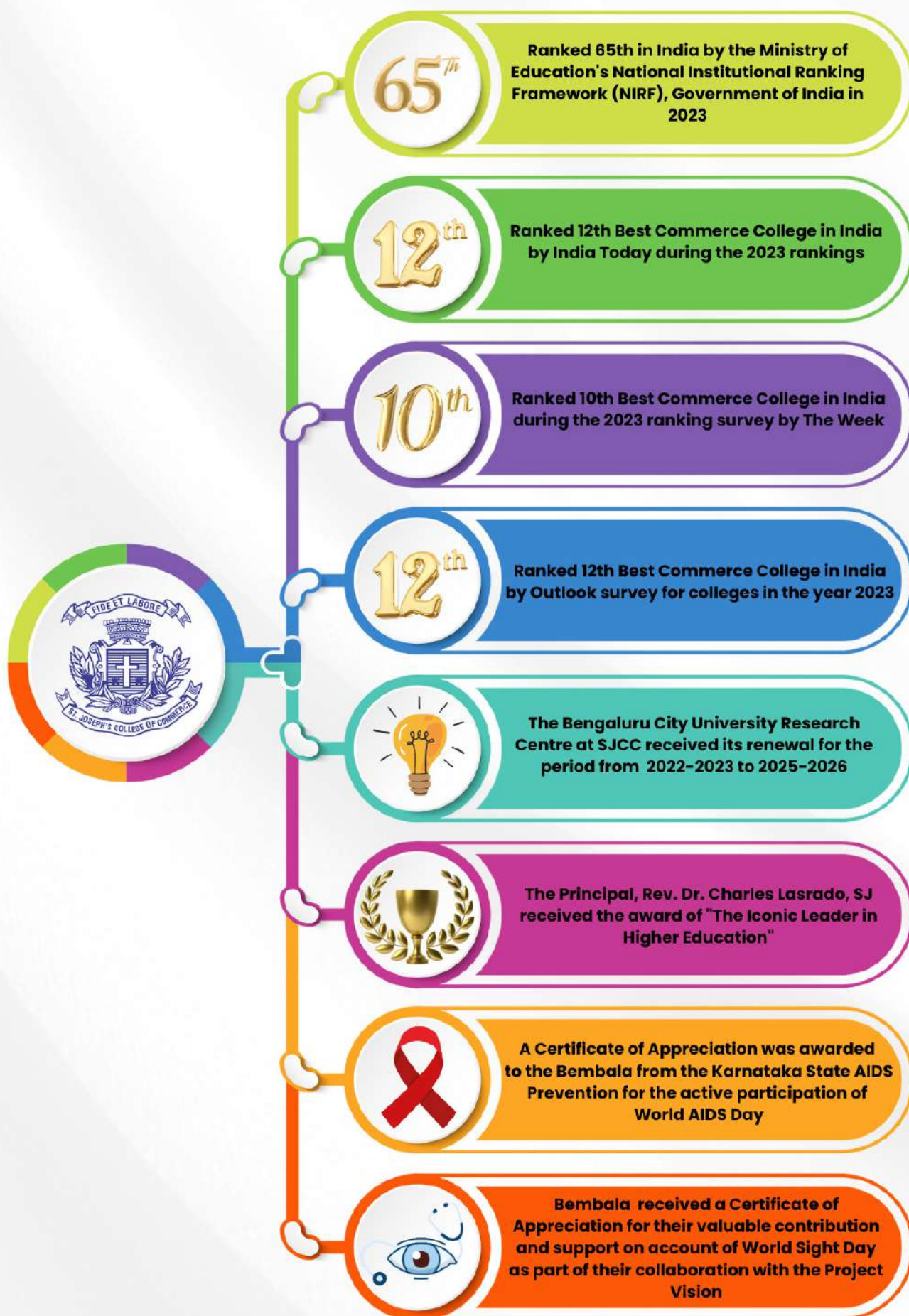
Each of the academic departments of the college organised national level or state level seminars / conferences, keeping up with the innovation in academics.

# TEDx SJCC 2023

On December 2nd, 2023, St. Joseph's College of Commerce, Bangalore, hosted TEDx SJCC under the theme "Narratives of Resilience," an event that captivated attendees with a series of profound talks and personal stories.

The day commenced with a warm welcome from Dr. Charles Lasrado SJ, principal of the college, setting the tone for the event. The event unfolded across four sessions, each delving into diverse aspects of resilience and personal growth through insightful narratives.

## TRIBE' 23

The Department of Economics at St. Joseph's College of Commerce, Bangalore, in collaboration with prominent institutions like IBEN, IISc, Fractal, IIMB, and IIT Madras, hosted an event on Behavioural Economics. This flagship event unfolded in three parts, each illuminating various facets of this burgeoning field.

### Part One: International Online Lecture

Kicking off on July 16th, 2023, the event commenced with an insightful international online lecture by Dr. Dilip Soman from the University of Toronto. Titled "Behavioural Science: Past, Present and Future,"

Dr. Soman's lecture provided a comprehensive overview of the evolution and future prospects of behavioural science, setting a robust foundation for subsequent discussions.

### Part Two: Nudge-athon Hackathon

On August 12th, 2023, the focus shifted to practical applications with the Nudge-athon held at IISc. This behavioural economics-themed hackathon engaged participants in creating innovative solutions that leverage behavioural insights to address real-world challenges.

### Part Three: TRIBE Conference

The culminating event, TRIBE, held on September 9th, 2023, at St. Joseph's College of Commerce, gathered over 200 corporates and 50 faculty members and students. The conference featured a keynote address titled "The Power of Behavioural Sciences" by Dr. Junofy Rozarina, CEO of Beyond Nudge and IBEN. Dr. Rozarina emphasized the relevance of behavioural sciences in understanding human decision-making processes, advocating for its integration into educational curricula and ethical practices.

A panel discussion on "Research in Behavioural Economics" followed, featuring distinguished experts from academia and industry. Discussions ranged from the challenges of generalizing research findings to the practical implications of behavioural economics in diverse sectors.

Principal Fr. Charles Lasrado, SJ concluded the panel session by acknowledging the invaluable contributions of the speakers.



# VIVIDHA 2023:

## An Intercollegiate Literary Festival

### Vividha – Ways of Storytelling

The Department of English hosted its first ever intercollegiate literary fest, Vividha, on the 25th and 27th of September 2023. The festival brought together a diverse range of talents, showcasing storytelling, journalism, art, and literature. A total of 500 students from 18 colleges participated in the festival which featured 14 competitions, two panel discussions, four workshops, and 'Kathegala Mane (House of Stories) - Museum of Material Memory' curated by the students of B.A. English. The festival was inaugurated by Ms. Indu Antony, a medical doctor turned artist.

The festival was coordinated by Mr. Thomas Mathew, and the museum by Ms. Vijayshanthi, along with the support from the students and staff of the Department of English.

Competitions like Journalistic Storytelling, Sketch a Story, Song Writing, Photo Story, Dialogue Writing, Poetry Writing, Fan Fiction, Elocution, Fill the Bubble, Video Essay, Short Story Writing, and Literature quiz provided students a space for creative expression. The themes for the competitions invited the students to carefully examine the world around them and challenged their creative abilities with language and communication.

### Workshop on Storytelling

The festival kicked off with an engaging workshop by Ms. Indu Antony, a trans-disciplinary artist whose performances and installations primarily revolve around the notion of spaces and their intangible character in relation to the gendered body as a site of representation. She shared her creative journey, spotlighting projects exploring feminist geography, mob mentality, and the enigmatic Cecelia. Her innovative storytelling, including engagement with police reports and local artisans, broke boundaries and added a unique touch to narrative dissemination.

### Panel Discussion on Journalistic Storytelling

The inaugural day featured a lively panel discussion on journalistic storytelling with journalists Ms. Liffy Thomas, Senior Correspondent and Assistant Editor at The Hindu, Ms. Vishaka George, Senior Editor at People's Archive of Rural India (PARI) and Ms. Indulekha Aravind, Senior Assistant Editor at The Economic Times. The discussion emphasized the importance of factual reporting in the face of misinformation.

### Student Panel

Vividha also featured an exclusive student panel on the topic "Finding your 'Self' through Stories" on 27th September. The panel members were Yatin Arora of Christ (Deemed-to-be-University), Ananya Mishra of Mount Carmel College, Ananya Mehta of St. Joseph's University and Santosh Samuel of SJCC. The discussion was moderated by Ms. Amulya B, an award-winning creative writer. Students spoke about their experiences of reading and listening to stories and how the process of reading helped them re-invent their 'selves'.

### Interactive Workshop on Painting

An interactive workshop on painting was organized on 25th September and the resource person was Ms. Diya Haneena (Mutthulaxmi), a Bangalore based artist. Ms. Diya spoke about telling stories through sketching and interacted with aspiring artists. She narrated her experience of painting, sketching, and telling stories.





### **Creative Writing Workshop**

A creative writing workshop was organized on 27th September, with the resource person being Ms. Amulya B, a creative writer who won the Toto Award for creative writing in English and Kannada. Ms. Amulya shared her experiences in creative writing and provided insights into the form and structure of short stories. More than 80 students from different colleges attended this workshop.

### **Poetry Writing Workshop**

A poetry writing workshop was conducted on 27th September and the resource person was Ms. Pratishtha Pandya, a poet and translator at People's Archive of Rural India. Ms. Pratishtha shared her journey as a poet and a translator of poems from Gujarati to English and English to Gujarati. She spoke about how poetry is an effective medium to speak about the body. She asked the participants to write poems and gave them feedback on what they had written. The workshop was attended by 80 students from different colleges.



### **‘Kathegala Mane (House of Stories) - Museum of Material Memory’**

Kathegala Mane was a unique attempt at getting the staff of SJCC involved in telling stories through objects. The students of B.A. English invited the staff of SJCC to contribute a material that is dear to them with memories. The students then interviewed the staff members who contributed an object to hear the stories connected to that object, which was then turned into a short narrative. The object and the story were then housed in the Xavier Hall for everyone to view. The materials included watches given by father, grandmother's sari, Palestinian flag, first gifts, baby tooth, items bought with the first salary, letters, and many more objects that told deeply personal stories. The museum was visited by students and staff of SJCC and also by participants of the festival. It was a unique opportunity for the SJCC community to know interesting stories of the staff members. The museum was hosted as part of the literature festival Vividha – 2023.





## CDLE

The Centre for Digital Learning and Education (CDLE) at SJCC has introduced a blended teaching and learning model for open elective courses and mandatory courses like Indian Constitution, Environmental Studies, and Yoga. Blended learning, a method that prioritizes students' needs and integrates technology to leverage both in-person and online learning environments, has been embraced by St. Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC) to enhance the learning experience and revolutionize teaching pedagogy.

The Blended Learning Model allocates one hour per week for face-to-face contact classes and two hours for non-contact classes. E-content materials including documents, videos, PDFs, and PowerPoint presentations, are meticulously curated and disseminated to students by their respective course instructors.

SJCC commenced the current academic year (2023-2024) on 26 June 2023 and since then, CDLE has organized several meetings. The team conducted orientation sessions for the course instructors of the open elective courses for an effective teaching-learning process. The sessions led by Mr. Vinay Pradeep and Mr. Merwin Abraham Mathew focused on the effective facilitation of a blended mode of learning of the open elective courses through MS Teams.

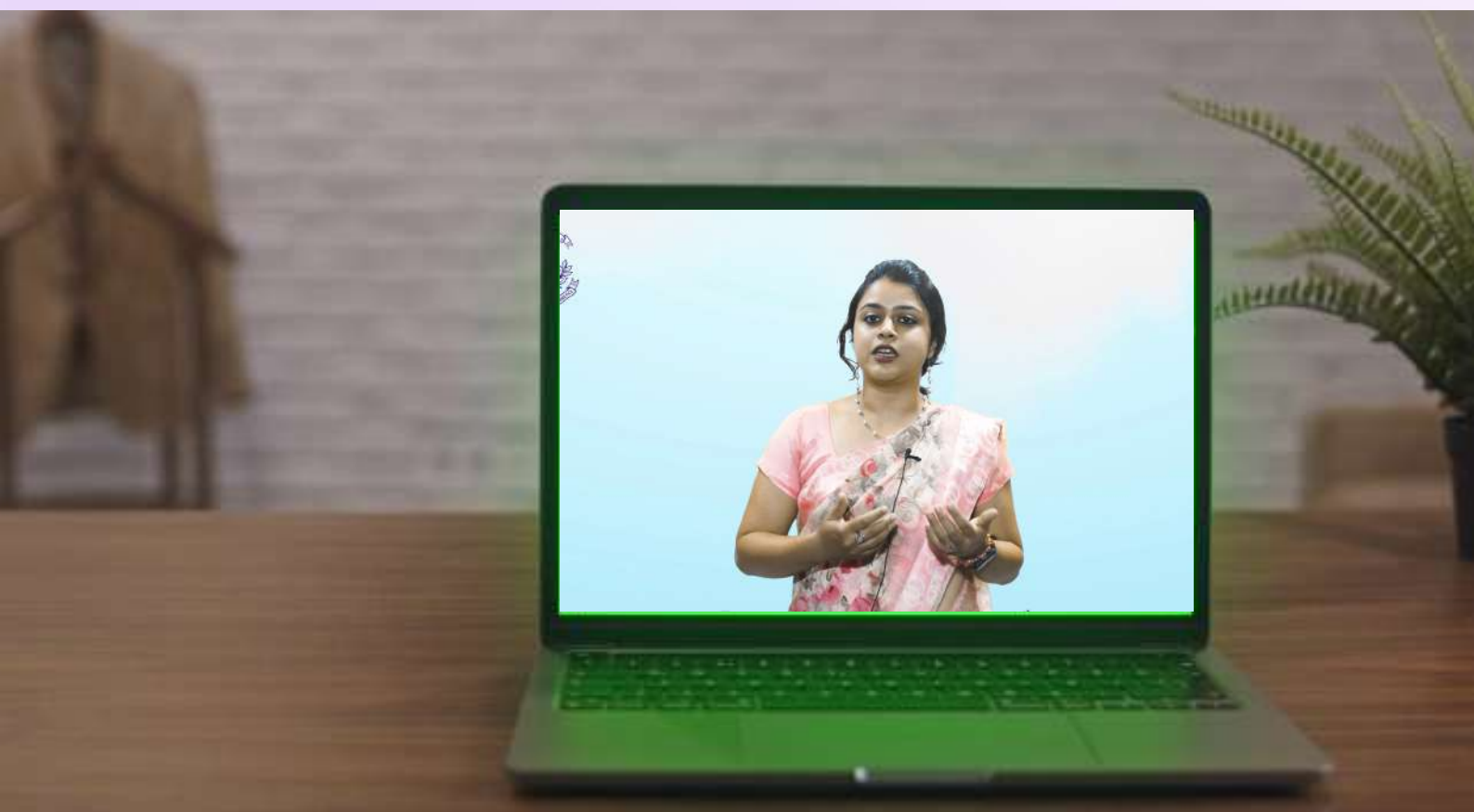




In the first week of July, members of CDLE set up the tiles, folders, and files for all open elective courses and uploaded the syllabus, videos, reference materials and guidelines. After this, the course instructors were guided in recording and editing lectures. The recording of the instructor's videos took place at the media room of SJCC and SJEC.

In the beginning of the academic year 2023-2024, CDLE completed recording and editing of 16 videos for 8 open elective courses. By the end of the academic year, a total of 56 videos were recorded and edited for different blended mode open elective courses (8 open courses in the odd sem and 4 in the even sem).

CDLE planned a new E- learning Platform built on Linways (SJCC E- learning Platform) in the odd semester. After testing this new platform four different open elective courses and mandatory courses like EVS and IC courses were offered on SJCC E-learning Platform on Linways with a total of 2000+ learners in the even semester.





# Annual Republic Day Lecture

The Annual Republic Day Lecture by the Department of English was conducted on 25th January 2024. This was the 6th edition of the same.

The lecture was delivered by Dr. Parakala Prabhakar. Dr. Prabhakar, an alumnus of JNU and the London School of Economics, is the MD of RightFOLIO, a knowledge enterprise based in Hyderabad. He is also a widely read columnist on current affairs and has a popular YouTube channel, 'Midweek Matters', where he discusses issues related to India's politics, economy, and contemporary society. The topic in discussion this year was, 'Rescuing the Republic: The Future of Democracy in India'. The Republic Day Lecture Series was designed to ensure a safe space for individuals to interact on ideas such as participation in democracy, pluralism and to facilitate interaction between students, public and academia. The series focuses mainly on contemporary socio-political and cultural challenges faced by the Indian Republic in today's context.

At the start of the lecture, Dr. Prabhakar discussed the major challenges we, as a Republic, are facing today. These challenges range from majoritarianism, communal disharmony, religious fundamentalism, social and economic disparities and injustices. Through his lecture he was able to point out various instances in which our government, our public institutions and most importantly how our leaders have strayed away from the ideals of our Republic.

Dr. Prabhakar also commented on the importance of education and how liberal classrooms are important in this fight against the Republic we currently live in. The session concluded with a brief Question and Answer session. His book, "The Crooked Timber of New India" was also available for purchase at the venue. This session was of utmost importance to all the attendees because what it truly did was show us a mirror of the society we live in. It truly made us realize that it is pertinent for the current generation to be aware about the situation and fight against this in all ways possible.









## Institution Day

The Institution Day was celebrated on 17th February 2024 at St. Joseph's College of Law with the theme 'Embracing Diversity and Celebrating Harmony.' The event commenced with a keynote address by Dr. Mohamed Tahan Mateen, whose insightful words resonated with the audience. # Internal Quality Assurance Cell



The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous) plays a vital role in maintaining high standards in all the academic activities on campus. IQAC is involved in setting benchmarks in the field of higher education, by applying numerous time-tested pedagogical approaches which transcend traditional classroom lectures. The cell also helps in the holistic development of its student community. IQAC at SJCC focuses primarily on quality enhancement of teaching, learning, evaluation, research, extension and consultancy opportunities.

## Quality Initiatives of the IQAC

### Expansion and (AQAR) Taskforce

The IQAC team has expanded to twenty members in accordance with the NAAC AQAR criteria. This structure has been established to facilitate the coordination and facilitation of information for the preparation of the AQAR and other rankings

### Preparation for Awards of the Institution

IQAC submitted an application to the Xavier Board under the 'Best college' and 'Best extension and outreach activities' categories on September 15, 2023. The application for the "Best Institutional Social Responsibility" category was submitted to the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FICCI) on September 12, 2023.

### Transparency Initiatives

IQAC contributes the required data to Undertaking Transformative Strategies and Actions in Higher Education (UTSAH), an initiative launched by the UGC to enhance the transparency of educational practices for diverse stakeholders.

### Rankings of the Institution

IQAC facilitated the collection and submission of data for the annual ranking procedures of the institution under The India Today Ranking, the Week Ranking, and the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF). The IQAC also successfully submitted the institution's data for the Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements (ARIIA) rating, which is an initiative by the central government.

### The SQAC Initiatives

The SQAC (Student Quality Assurance Cell) was presented at the Parent-Teacher Association Meeting, which was scheduled on September 16, 2023. Three hundred parents of first-year students attended the meeting. The collected feedback was compiled and used to determine the next course of action.

### Students Progression Report

Every year, IQAC records data of students' progression to higher education and the placement of outgoing students. This year, student progression information will be mobilised through the ERP, and the ERP schema has been validated.

## **The Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA)**



Academic & Administrative Audit Committee was constituted this academic year, 2023-24. The purpose of an academic audit is to encourage programs, departments and the institution to evaluate the quality processes and standards based on predetermined benchmarks and to suggest activities required in producing, assuring, and regularly improving the quality of the whole system including curricular and co-curricular programmes and activities and the

infrastructure and support services. The AAA is a peer review process including a self-study and a site visit by peers from inside and outside the institution. A template for a self-study report which records vital information on course completion and any inputs on syllabus alterations and a template for the audit of academic and administrative committees are some of the initiatives taken so far by the AAA.

## **Learning Tuesdays - Building Teacher Effectiveness**

In a bid for continual growth as educators, the “Learning Tuesdays - Building Teacher Effectiveness” initiative was introduced. These sessions aim to enrich teaching methodologies by exploring personal experiences in teaching, learning, and evaluation. The initiative focuses on fostering professional growth through dialogue and shared experiences.

## **Welfare Officers**

In the academic year 2023-24, our institution took significant strides to enhance student welfare by introducing two pivotal positions: Welfare Officer (Boys) and Welfare Officer (Girls). These officers served as empathetic pillars, providing a supportive environment. As part of this initiative, an event on “Social Media: Etiquette and Legal Implications” was hosted, engaging students from all classes.





## Activities of IQAC

- The IQAC newsletter was published on 12th December 2023
- IQAC submitted the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) 2022-23 of the institution.
- The AISHE report for the year 2022-23 was submitted in March 15th, 2024. AISHE, the All India Survey on Higher Education, is a Ministry of Human Resource Development initiative.
- The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS), Student Progression Survey, and Exit Survey of the final year undergraduate and postgraduate students were conducted in March 2024. This year Course (Subject) evaluation is mandatory to all the UG and PG Students and was conducted in March, 2024.
- A lecture on Leadership and Employability Skills was organised for the students on 7 September 2023 by Ms. Navyashree A, Assistant Manager Audit at Grant Thornton.
- A one-day workshop on Awareness on NAAC Accreditation and Academic Goals was conducted for the faculty members on 25 October 2023. It was taken by a series of esteemed speakers on various topics.
- IQAC annually conducts open mic sessions for the students to enhance the quality of teaching and learning. Along with a common open mic a separate session of ladies' open mic is conducted as well, students address their concern in the open mic session. The open mic session includes the IQAC Coordinator and the Vice Principals. IQAC was instrumental in implementing various quality initiatives on campus based on the previous years' open mic session.
- IQAC has presented the summary of reports from the open house, exit interview, and student satisfaction survey in the Academic Council (TQM) meeting for further action.
- An institution SWOC analysis session for Faculty was organized by the DTU Steering Committee on 9th February 2024. Dr. Anil Joseph Pinto, Registrar Christ University was the resource person for the session.
- A session titled 'Contemplating NIRF and NAAC' was organised to provide insights about NIRF and NAAC and to conduct a SWOC analysis on the institution. The session was conducted on 19th October 2023, facilitated by Dr. Raja Jebasingh, Department of Commerce, Dr. Shridhar, IQAC Coordinator and Prof. Muktha.
- A Three-Day AIACHE Workshop was coordinated for the non-teaching staff from 13th to 15th March 2024 on "Three-Day Capacity Enhancement Workshop on Leveraging AI Tools for Office Automation."







# Curricular Aspects

## **Curriculum Design and Development**

The institution is dedicated to educating students in the fields of Commerce, Business, Arts, and Science alongside ensuring that they grow into self-aware individuals committed to social causes. The implementation of the Outcome-Based Education (OBE) model within the framework of NEP in the institution since the academic year 2021-22, synthesises the teaching and research experience of the faculty and guides the process of designing and developing the curriculum. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) helps enhance students' knowledge across different disciplines of study.

The various stakeholders of the institution are involved in the designing of the curriculum and the latest developments in the fields are taken into consideration for developments in the same. The alumni, subject experts and industry professionals are actively involved in the development of the curriculum to ensure that it is updated and benefits all the stakeholders of the institution.

## **National Education Policy 2020**

The State Government Task Force suggested NEP-2020 Implementation Framework for the higher educational institutions in Karnataka. The same had been revised from time to time with respect to courses and credits offered by the various programmes at the college. The NEP Committee had been active in meeting and ensuring the incorporation of the revised changes and disseminating the same to higher-ups in the Institution. The Committee had verified and suggested changes to the Model Programme Structures of all the undergraduate programmes before the syllabi were presented at the respective Board of Studies meetings.

## **Outcome-Based Education (OBE)**

In the pursuit of academic excellence, our institution remains committed to the principles of Outcome-Based Education (OBE), a transformative approach that focuses on defining specific learning outcomes and aligning educational processes to achieve those outcomes. Through meticulous Outcome-Based curriculum design, Outcome-Based Teaching and Learning process, Outcome-Based continuous assessment, and feedback mechanisms, we ensure that our students acquire not only knowledge, not only essential Skills but also the right attitude and competencies required for success in their chosen fields. OBE empowers our learners to become critical thinkers, effective communicators, and lifelong learners, preparing them for the dynamic challenges of the modern world. We witness the positive impact of this pedagogical model on our student's academic growth and personal development. The integration of OBE in our educational framework remains instrumental in shaping well-rounded individuals poised for success in their future endeavours.

## **Multidisciplinary Approach**

The three-year undergraduate programmes at SJCC offer a wide range of multidisciplinary programmes. Ability, vocational, professional and skill enhancement opportunities are also offered by each programme. The four-year honours programmes across the disciplines of Commerce, Management, Arts, and Science combine conceptual understanding with practical engagement through lab courses, national and international field visits, internships, conferences, workshops, seminars, case study analysis, group discussions and research projects. ## **Curriculum Planning and Implementation**

The Board of Studies is the basic constituent of the academic system of an autonomous institution and is entrusted with the responsibility of curriculum planning and implementation. Framing the syllabi for various courses under each programme, reviewing and updating the syllabi from time to time, introducing new courses in a programme, determining details of continuous assessment, recommending panels of examiners under the semester system, etc. form the core responsibilities of the members of the Board of Studies. The Board of Studies composition and functions at the institution are as per the UGC guidelines and constitute the Head of the department, faculty members of the department, university nominee, subject experts, a representative from the industry/corporate sector/allied area, and alumni nominated by the Principal.



## **Curriculum Enrichment**

Holistic development of students is an important aspect of the institution's education. With professional programmes like BBA Entrepreneurship, ACCA, BPM (Industry Integrated), B. Com (Analytics), and B.Com (Travel and Tourism) the students widen their scope of employability. The curriculum is enriched with programmes like Advanced Excel, Tally, SPSS Digital fluency, Artificial Intelligence, SAP, Yoga, Environmental Studies, Indian Constitution and Psychological Well-being to give them hands-on experience with skills and creates a multidimensional perspective in them augmenting holistic development of students. Industrial visits, international student exchange programmes and live projects, and exposure to the business world are embedded components of the curriculum. Furthermore, research culture is an integral aspect of the curriculum. Dissertations and minor and major research projects make students industry-ready and manifest the institution's holistic approach towards education. ## **Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs)**

The students of SJCC enrol in various interdisciplinary courses offered in the NPTEL SWAYAM portal. The duration of the courses enrolled is 8 weeks comprising of weekly assignments. On completion of the weekly assignments and satisfying the criteria as per the course, the students are required to take up a final exam in a centralised examination centre. Currently, MOOCs are offered as Open Elective courses only to the 1st and 3rd semester students in the odd semester and 2nd semester students in the even semester. Students started enrolling for MOOCs in June 2023, for the odd semester and December 2023, for the even semester in academic year 2023-2024. There were a few mandatory specifications for the students to follow while enrolling for the courses in SWAYAM. It is communicated to students who enrolled for the MOOCs that it is mandatory to take up the examination scheduled in SWAYAM to become eligible for receiving the certificate.

## Research at SJCC

Research is an integral component of academic excellence at SJCC. The college has a Research Centre recognised by the Bengaluru City University, and the Centre plays a vital role in fostering research culture at the institution. The institution facilitates research in four significant parts – PhD Programme with Bangalore University (BU)/Bengaluru City University (BCU), Departmental Support for Research to Undergraduate (UG) and Postgraduate (PG) Students, BJES Seed Money Project, and Faculty (Individual/Joint) Research. The Centre supports by organizing experiential workshops on research methodology, training programmes, seminars, and conferences. Additionally, it assists the departments in providing an elaborate platform for both departmental students and external researchers. The Centre assists the departments in reviewing the synopsis submitted by the final year students as part of their dissertation projects and ensures that quality research projects are undertaken by the students.



### **Research Support to Undergraduate and Postgraduate Students**

The SJCC Research Centre places significant importance on student research by actively engaging and providing support to the undergraduate departments of Commerce and Management, as well as the Department of Postgraduate Studies in Commerce. These departments have established exclusive associations to cultivate a research culture among students.

Mainframe Research Forum, an initiative of the Department of Commerce, aims to assist students in developing the ability to effectively engage in research. It guides them through seminars, conferences, guest lectures, workshops, and training programmes.

The Quest Club of the Department of Management helps students with logical reasoning and critical thinking. The activities of the club supplement the skill set of students in the field of research through seminars, conferences, guest lectures, workshops, and training programmes. The Post Graduate Department of Commerce organizes various programmes to enhance the research skills of the students.

### **Highlights of the SJCC Research Centre – 2023-24:**

The Centre received eight newly recognized PhD Research Supervisors in Commerce approved by the Bengaluru City University.

The Centre revamped the research policies of the college regarding the promotion of research, the code of ethics to check malpractices and plagiarism in research, and the seed money research grant policy.

The Centre initiated the process of starting a PhD program on campus. It invited applications from eligible research supervisors and planned meetings with advocates and research supervisors to address legal aspects related to the program. The Centre compiled and organized the bio-data of research supervisors, identified eligible ones to guide future PhD scholars, and sent an official letter seeking permission to the Registrar (Evaluation) of Bengaluru City University and the Higher Education Council for the commencement of the PhD program on campus.

The Desk at the college has taken the initiative to participate in the IAJU Global Citizenship Curriculum Project. Under this, the students are invited to take part in the IAJU Global Citizenship Curriculum Project, launched in Boston under the auspices of the Task Force, which builds on and scales the success of the Global Citizenship Fellows Program by connecting students and faculty across the Jesuit network of some 200 colleges and universities worldwide through a shared Global Citizenship Course Module.

# Training and Placement

The College maintains its exemplary reputation by creating industry-ready and competent individuals who get placed through the placement activities organised by the College Placements Cell. The College has a faculty-in-charge who is the Placements Officer on the campus and plays a seminal role in connecting the students to the industry. Over the years, the students of the college have been placed in prestigious and renowned industries

## **Pre-Placement Process and Skill Development**

Pre-Placement Process and Skill Development comprises of activities to prepare the pre-final/final year students of the institution for the placement opportunities in their outgoing year. Activities ranging from career mapping, career guidance, and workshops on aptitude, soft skills, and technical skills to excel in interviews are organized for students.

The industry academia interface is another focal area for the cell, through which it has courses, seminars, and guest talks in collaboration with companies during the academic year. Second-year students take up corporate internships to help them have an easy transition into the final recruitment process.



The placement Process followed at the institution is divided into three different phases for the smooth functioning of the placement activities.

Phase one includes a briefing on the college placement policy/code of conduct for students, a pre-placement workshop, a series of guest talks, and career mapping sessions.

Phase two includes registration by students interested in campus placement and the final phase is when we have the companies visiting the institution to conduct an on-campus recruitment drive.



## Placement Orientation

Placement orientations were conducted for UG and PG Students. More than 400 students were interested in taking part in placement drives for the academic year 2023-24. From BCOM / BBA & MCOM.

### **Pre-Placement Process and Skill Development Outline**

Career Recruitment Training (CRT) is organized by SJCC in association with Disciples India Group with a two-week Employability Training Workshop to fine-tune the skills of students to make them industry-ready. CRT Prep conducted this workshop for the final year students from 10th July 2023 to 30th July 2023. Spread over a period of two weeks, this workshop included quantitative modules, logical reasoning, resume building, mock interviews, and soft skills development sessions and a Personal Interview. CRT Programme was conducted in a virtual platform.

The recruitment exercise commenced in college as early as the last week of June 2023. The organizations offered diverse roles varying from finance, accounts, marketing, and human resources, to name a few. Information about placements was made available to students through the college ERP & SMS system, E-Mails, social media platforms, and placement notice board. For this academic year, 478 Undergraduate & Postgraduate students registered for campus placements (who are eligible for placement activities) of which 190 students have been offered jobs by various companies, and many more are in the pipeline for recruitment and selection.

## **Internship Report of the Undergraduate Programmes**

Internship is mandated by the National Education Policy-2020 and is a compulsory part of the curricular aspects to facilitate the integration of theoretical learning through application and practice at the workplace. The Placement Cell assists students to pursue internships in corporate offices, industries, and non-profit organisations to connect and apply the concepts learnt in the classroom. Three distinctive internship programmes are conducted by the Placements Cell at the campus:

**Corporate Internships:** Corporate internships are mandatory for 2nd-year B. Com and BBA students, offering practical industry exposure alongside classroom studies. It aims at enabling the students to get practical exposure to different functions of the industry that further supplements classroom learning with practical experience. Students must complete a 4-to-6-week internship before their fifth semester, submitting a report evaluated through a viva-voce for credits. These credits are awarded in the sixth semester. In the 2023-24 academic year, approximately 915 students from the 2021 batch undertook internships between June and August 2023, both online and offline, across India and abroad.

## **Internship Recruitment for Pre-Final Year Students 2023-24**

During the odd semester of 2023-24, the Placements & Internship Cell arranged recruitment sessions for different organizations visiting the campus. These sessions aimed to select students for part-time corporate internships or internships feasible for the upcoming summer of the Academic Year 2024-25.



**Social Internship:** The Social Internship is an integral component of the curriculum, fostering a sense of social responsibility among students. In 2022, a group of 568 B. Com students engaged in Social Internships, dedicating 60 hours during their second year of study. These internships were completed prior to the start of their fourth semester, in January 2023. Following the internships, students submitted reports which were then evaluated through viva voce examinations. Credits for their participation were subsequently allocated to the relevant department.



## Student Community

Student support is one of the significant aspects of holistic learning practices followed at the institution. The institution, through its diversified curricular programmes and co-curricular activities, aims to offer a wide variety of platforms to help students identify their passion and encourage their intellectual curiosity. In order to realise this vision, the institution has designed an effective student support framework.

The college extends financial aid to deserving candidates through scholarships and free-ships. It has established mentorship programmes, workshops, pre-placement support, and guidance aid amongst many others to meet the changing demands of holistic education pedagogy. The institution also offers an inclusive learning environment for students irrespective of their social and religious backgrounds. Students with disabilities are also given additional support in terms of their movement on campus and during examinations. Attempts are made to help learners at different learning levels through remedial classes, bridge course tests, and individual tutoring sessions.

The Counselling centre arranges confidential counselling sessions for students to ensure their emotional well-being. Thus, the student support initiatives of the institution have been instrumental in enhancing the overall learning experience of the student community. Above all, the multidimensional training offered at SJCC prepares students for efficiently dealing with diverse real-life challenges.

The college makes learning conducive for students who pursue professional programmes like the Association of Certified Chartered Accountants (ACCA), Certified Management Accountant (CMA), and Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA).

## **Scholarships**

### **Government Scholarship**

To provide necessary encouragement and motivation to pursue Higher Education, the Government of Karnataka and the Central Government provide various scholarship schemes to meritorious and economically backward students. At SJCC students are sent notifications of the scholarships and encouraged to apply for these scholarships. The college has also deputed a faculty-in-charge to channelise the scholarships and fellowships offered by the UGC.

### **Management Scholarship**

The management awards scholarships to meritorious students coming from economically weaker sections of society. The Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES) has set up the Management Scholarship Fund. The college has set up a Management Scholarship Committee to recognise needy, meritorious and deserving students in academics, sports and co-curricular activities. The scholarship applications are screened and the beneficiaries are selected based on set criteria of selection. In the current year Rs. 1,35,00,000/- worth of scholarships were disbursed to deserving students.

### **OSA Scholarship**

The Alumni of the college have a fund and the income generated from the fund is used to grant scholarships annually to students from economically weaker sections of the society. The alumni have formed a committee which independently scrutinizes the applicants and holds interviews with their parents to determine genuine beneficiaries. During the current academic year, Rs. 25,25,000/- worth of scholarships was granted to the students from the alumni scholarship fund.

As the name of the programme BEMBALA suggests, it aims to reach out to the deprived groups and vulnerable sections of society and create opportunities for education, awareness and skill enhancement. It intends to create a learning process for faculty and students, through exposure to community needs, problems, and issues. It hopes to reach out to the community by designing need-based interventions and generating research. Eventually, it will facilitate networking and linkages of the community with NGOs, institutions, and government agencies for the effective service delivery and advocacy support. It also hopes to link up with the corporate sector within the parameters of Corporate Social Responsibilities (CSR).

### **Government School Visit**

To enhance the inclusiveness among the student community, students visited the Maulana Azad school to promote and create a fun learning experience among school children. The activities conducted in the school fostered a sense of responsibility and imparted valuable knowledge to become responsible adults.



### **Paper Cover Making & Distribution**

To raise awareness about utilizing paper bags instead of plastic covers, students were taught to make paper covers, and distributed them to nearby hawkers while spreading awareness about the environmental benefits of paper bags over plastic bags. This activity emphasized the importance of sustainability and responsible consumer choices and gave the students a sense of satisfaction in creating an eco-friendly environment.

### **Cleanliness Drive**

## Student Council Report

The college administration emphasizes the importance of student involvement in the academic decision-making processes to enhance institutional progress. To facilitate this, students are actively engaged in college affairs across various levels and are integral to the decision-making process. Citizenship training is an integral part of education at this institution. As part of the citizenship training, the college has instituted a Student Council which is elected directly by students. The Student Council comprises President, Vice-president, Treasurer, General Secretary, Academic Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Sports Secretary and Ladies Secretary. There is a clear division of responsibilities among the members of the Student Council with the President as the head. Additionally, they spearhead initiatives aimed at enhancing student welfare. An extended Students' Council includes various student representatives such as Department Coordinators, Association Coordinators, College team heads, IQAC coordinators, and Academic, Cultural, Sports and Women representatives of each class in the college. This body facilitates communication among students and provides leadership opportunities. The Student Quality Assurance Cell (SQAC), a component of the IQAC, focuses on improving overall college performance. Student representatives from each class are involved in SQAC activities to ensure excellence at the classroom level.

# Counselling and Student Wellbeing

## Personal Counselling

Students take appointments with the counsellor for one-on-one personal counselling sessions and work closely on overcoming their problems. Students come with issues related to peer pressure, transition into college life, adjustment issues, emotional issues like fear, anger, grief, and anxiety, academic issues like performance, attendance and inappropriate behaviour, low self-esteem, trauma and other psychological distress.

## Student Support Services

In addition, class mentors and teachers refer students to counsellors when they feel that the student requires emotional support. Counsellors also recommend teachers to give special attention to students who require help. Family members are also met by the counsellors when the need arises. The counselling team has also extended their services to students in times of emergencies when they have been taken to the hospital from college, to provide strength and support.

## Samagra (St. Joseph's Holistic Wellness Center)

The counsellors at SJCC have been actively involved in the activities of SAMAGRA. Counsellors regularly attend monthly meetings at the Samagra offices. During these meetings and discussions, various concerns have been raised and discussed to improve the quality of mental health services provided at SJCC. These discussions have been highly insightful with case presentations, book reviews and group interactions. The SJCC team has helped build resources for the SAMAGRA website by contributing psychoeducational videos, blogs and articles.

## Group Counselling

The counsellors meet the students in groups of 5-6 as part of the outreach program organized by BEMBALA. These sessions provide them with a space for self-discovery by learning from each other, recognising and embracing their strengths and capabilities and accepting their shortcomings. This also gives the counsellors a chance to build rapport

with the students and create awareness about the counselling process and various concerns that students at their age may have. Group sessions are conducted in the first year for UG and PG students.

## Psychological Well-being Programme

As part of their curriculum, all the first-year students have a mandatory course on Psychological Well-Being during their first semester which is a 2-credit paper. These sessions were designed to help students become more aware of themselves, and others around them, using a lot of reflective activities and exercises- individual and group. The department developed a course plan for the same with five modules based on the PERMA model. This included topics on Positive Emotions, Relationships, Meaning of life, goal setting and Achievement. The classes were divided into twelve sessions and it was conducted through various activities, skill-building and reflective exercises. Approximately 1000 students attended the classes. Students were assessed on their performance in these activities. These sessions were designed to help students become more aware of themselves, and others around them, using a lot of activities.

## Awareness Programmes

On June 26, 2023, St. Joseph's College of Commerce, in association with Cubbon Park Police, hosted an awareness programme on Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. This initiative aligned with the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, aimed to raise awareness of the societal impact of illicit drugs.







# Campus Ministry

## ***Samagra- Bembala-Ignitors Orientation for First Year UG Students***

The Samagra-Bembala-Ignitors Orientation for the first year UG students was held on Friday, June 23rd, 2023. The topics covered during the sessions were Mental Health and Awareness, Social Analysis and Character Formation.

The Samagra sessions helped to understand the importance of mental health, and the various counselling services which are available for their holistic development. The character formation sessions helped the students to learn about the importance of developing a strong character which is essential for their overall growth.

## ***Footprints Annual Retreat for UG & PG students***

The annual retreat for Catholic students of first, second and third years under various Under-Graduate programmes was held on 1st July, 8th July and 15th July, 2023 respectively. The retreat titled 'Footprints' which was conducted by the Campus Ministry team gave the participants a taste of Ignatian spiritual practices and prayer methods. Jesuit priests from the Karnataka Jesuit Province and Diocesan priests were the resource persons for the retreat. Around 750 Catholic students attended the retreat. Confessions were also held for the students. The retreat concluded with the Mass of the Holy Spirit, during which the entire congregation prayed for the repose of Anik Mugthihalli. Praveen, a student of 2 BBA D, who passed away on June 21st, 2023. The Holy Mass was also a memorial mass in honor of Fr. Stan Swamy SJ, a social activist (1937-2021).

## ***Mass on the Feast Day of St. Ignatius of Loyola***

The feast day of St. Ignatius of Loyola was held on July 30th, 2023, at Xavier Hall. Fr. Prashanth Madtha SJ was the celebrant for the mass. Fr. Charles Lasrado SJ, the Principal, Fr. Michael John SJ, Fr. Sunith Prabhu SJ, Fr. Oswald Mascarenhas SJ and Fr. Vishal D'Souza SJ were also present as celebrants. 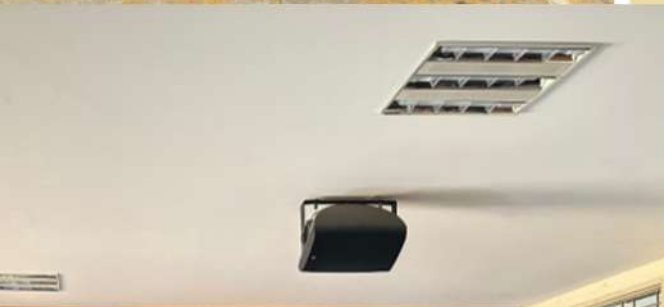
## **Eco Club**

### Teachers' Day

Teachers' Day was celebrated at the college on the 5th of September 2023 with great enthusiasm and respect. The Old Students Association ensured that the event served as a heartfelt gesture of gratitude to the faculty for their invaluable contributions. The dedicated and energetic committee organized engaging games, which were warmly received by the attendees. The celebrations concluded with a sumptuous lunch, catered by a distinguished alumnus of the institution. As a token of appreciation, each member of the staff was presented with a takeaway gift.

There are three types of scholarships awarded by the OSA.

### Scholarships to the College:

For the 1st year 54 applications were received. For the 2nd year 68 applications were received and for the third year 63 applications were received. Therefore, a total of 185 applications were received and shortlisted as well. 175 students were interviewed and a total of 166 students were awarded the scholarship. The total amount awarded in lakhs was 6.85 for the 1st year, 9.65 for the 2nd year and 8.75 for the 3rd year. Hence, a total of Rs. 25.25 lakhs were awarded.

### Multi Batch Scholarships

A few Alumni from SJCC have come forward and committed to contribute a sum of money every year to take care of the education of 50 students from PUC to Degree. This was started last year and continued this year as well. 130 applications were received for I PUC Day, 16 applications were received for I PUC Evening, 94 applications were received for II PUC Day and 24 applications were received for II PUC Evening. Therefore, a total of 264 applications were received. 73 applicants for I PUC Day, 10 applicants for I PUC Evening, 74 applicants for II PUC Day and 4 applicants for II PUC Evening attended the interview, making it a total of 161 interviewees. Scholarships were awarded to 57 for I PUC Day, 10 for I PUC Evening, 43 for II PUC Day and 4 for II PUC Evening. Hence, a total of 114 scholarships were awarded. Rs. 13.76 lakhs were awarded to I PUC Day scholars, Rs. 94,000 was awarded to I PUC Evening scholars, Rs. 9 lakhs were awarded to II PUC Day scholars and Rs. 35,000 was awarded to II PUC Evening scholars. A total of Rs. 24.05 lakhs were awarded.

The OSA has identified 114 students who have been paid 40% of their college fees. These students will be helped right through their college education.

### Scholarships to Bhavishyajyothi students

The Bhavishyajyothi Education Society (BJES) is committed to fostering educational opportunities for underprivileged children by providing scholarships that support their academic pursuits. These scholarships are available for students at various educational levels, including SSLC, PUC, and Degree courses. BJES aims to ensure that talented individuals, regardless of financial constraints, have access to quality education.

### Advance Course for GST

Based on the good response received with the Skills Development Course conducted in the previous year, the Alumni conducted an advance course on GST for the students pursuing 2nd and 3rd year of their course. 32 students attended and completed the course, certificates were awarded for the same.





## Sports Report

The activities for the year 2023-24 commenced in the month of July. The report captures the events conducted from July for the academic year 2022-2023 (BCU Calendar) and 2023-24. Internal selections were conducted for 13 sports teams and individual sports events. The students were admitted based on their Sports Merit. A total of 706 students registered for these selections, and by August 3rd, 2023, all 13 teams and individual sports events were finalized through a meticulous selection process.

The Sports Induction Ceremony was held on August 4th, 2023, in the Loyola Hall. This solemn ceremony was graced by the presence of our Chief Guests, Mrs. Poonam Belliappa, an International Athlete and Ekalavya Awardee, Dr. Charles Lasrado, SJ, the Principal, and esteemed staff members. A total of 167 students were given the Pledge of Honor and inducted into 13 various teams, including both Men & Women.

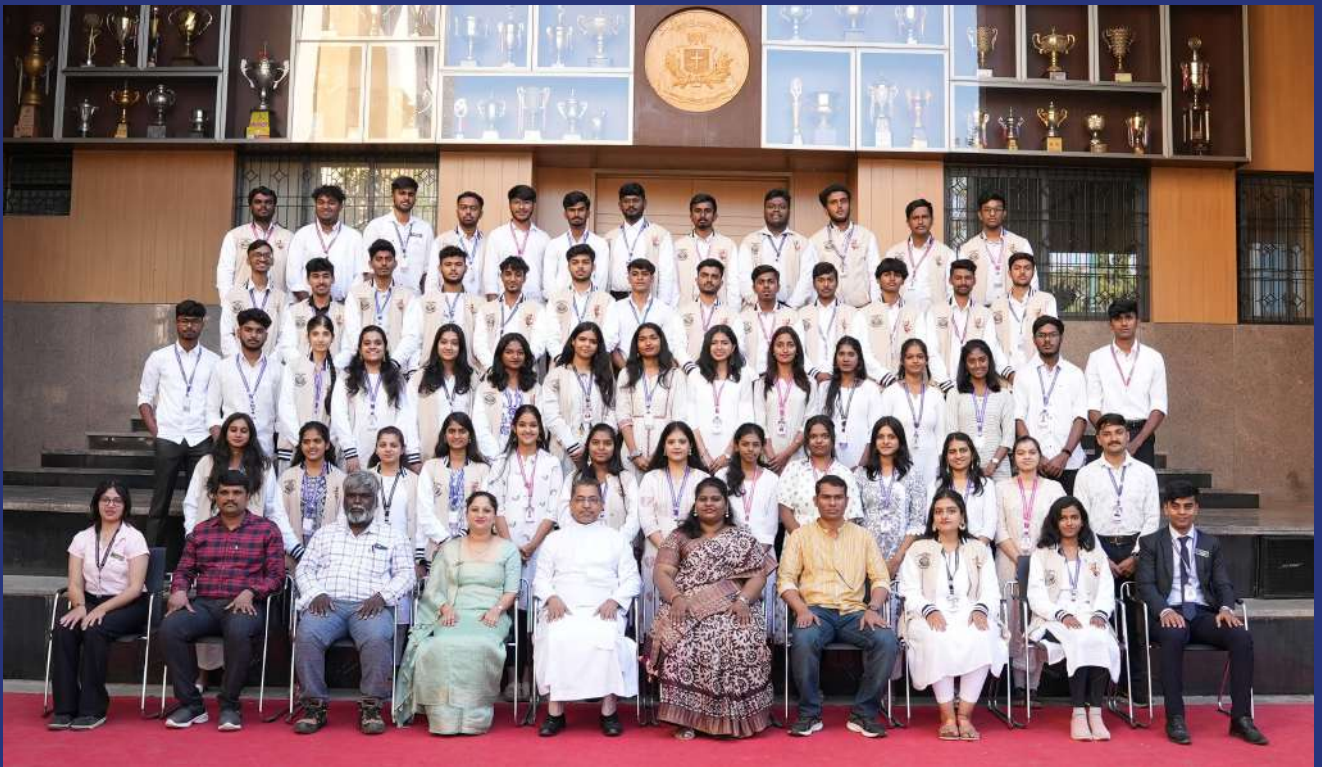

## लचीलापन

लचीलापन प्रतिकूल परिस्थितियों, आघात या महत्वपूर्ण तनाव से अनुकूलन और उभरने की क्षमता है। लचीलापन एक अंतर्निहित गुण नहीं है, बल्कि एक कौशल है जिसे समय के साथ विकसित और मजबूत किया जा सकता है। इसमें सकारात्मक दृष्टिकोण बनाए रखना, भावनाओं को प्रबंधित करना, लचीला होना, समस्याओं का प्रभावी ढंग से हल निकालना और सामाजिक समर्थन प्राप्त करना आदि शामिल हैं। लचीलेपन का तात्पर्य चुनौतियों, कठिनाई या अत्यधिक दबाव से समायोजित होना और प्रतिक्रिया प्रकट करना है। लचीलापन अच्छे मानसिक और शारीरिक स्वास्थ्य को बनाए रखने, अवसाद और तनाव से संबंधित बीमारियों जैसी स्थितियों से बचाने में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाता है, साथ ही व्यक्तिगत विकास को बढ़ावा देने और जीवन की गुणवत्ता को बढ़ाने में भी महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाता है। लचीलापन विकसित करने के लिए मजबूत संबंधों का पोषण करना, आशावादी दृष्टिकोण विकसित करना, उद्देश्यों की स्थापना करना और पिछले मुठभेड़ों से अंतर्दृष्टि प्राप्त करना शामिल हैं। सामान्य तौर पर, लचीलापन लोगों को जीवन की चुनौतियों से बेहतर ढंग से निपटने और बाधाओं के बावजूद सफल होने में मदद करता है। जो लोग लचीले होते हैं, वे अक्सर उद्देश्य और दिशा की भावना रखते हैं, जो उन्हें कठिन समय के दौरान केंद्रित और प्रेरित रहने में मदद करता है। ठोस रिश्तों को बढ़ावा देना, स्वस्थ जीवन शैली अपनाना और मुकाबला करने की व्यवस्था विकसित करना लचीलेपन के विकास के महत्वपूर्ण घटक हैं। एक बदलती दुनिया में, लचीलापन एक महत्वपूर्ण गुणवत्ता के रूप में खड़ा होता है जो व्यक्तियों को अनुग्रह और दृढ़ संकल्प के साथ जीवन की जटिलताओं को नेविगेट करने में मदद करता है। इसलिए विकास और अनुकूलन को बढ़ावा देने के लिए लचीला होना महत्वपूर्ण है, जिससे लोग प्रतिकूल परिस्थितियों का सामना करने में अधिक मजबूत और सक्षम बन सकें।

प्रतिकूलता का मतलब यह नहीं है कि हम अपने दुखों और असफलताओं को नकारते हैं, बल्कि इसका मतलब है कि हम उनसे सीखते हैं और मजबूत होते हैं। जिंदगी में हर किसी को कभी-कभी कठिनाईयों का सामना करना पड़ता है, लेकिन उसके बावजूद हमें हार नहीं माननी चाहिए।

असफलता के समय अगर हम प्रतिकूलता दिखाते हैं, तो हमारे अन्दर नई ऊर्जा और संघर्ष की भावना उत्पन्न होती है। यही हमारे व्यक्तित्व को मजबूत बनाती है और हमें अपने लक्ष्यों की ओर प्रेरित करती है। जीवन में सफलता पाने के लिए प्रतिकूलता की आवश्यकता होती है। यदि हम कभी हार मान लेते हैं, तो हमारे अंतर्निहित क्षमताओं का संकोच हो जाता है और हम अपने मकसदों से पीछे हटने लगते हैं। इसलिए, प्रतिकूलता हमारे लिए एक महत्वपूर्ण गुण होता है जो हमें उच्चतम सफलता की ओर बढ़ने में सहायता देती है। इस प्रकार, प्रतिकूलता जीवन का एक महत्वपूर्ण हिस्सा है। यह हमें शिक्षा देती है कि हालातों के खिलाफ नहीं हारना, बल्कि उनसे सीखना और मजबूत होकर आगे बढ़ना। इसी तरह, प्रतिकूलता हमें एक सकारात्मक दिशा में जीवन जीने की कला सिखाती है।

### संघर्षशीलता और धैर्य

संघर्षशीलता, जिसे हम धैर्य और आत्मविश्वास के रूप में भी जानते हैं, किसी भी व्यक्ति के जीवन में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाती है। यह वह गुण है जो हमें कठिनाइयों से लड़ने और जीवन में आगे बढ़ने के लिए प्रेरित करता है। मेरे जीवन में भी एक ऐसी घटना घटित हुई। उस घटना ने मुझे संघर्षशीलता का असली अर्थ समझाया और मुझे और अधिक मजबूत बनाया।

यह घटना उस समय की है जब मैं बारहवीं कक्षा के बोर्ड परीक्षा की तैयारी कर रही थी। यह समय हर छात्र के लिए बहुत महत्वपूर्ण होता है और मेरे लिए भी था। लेकिन इस महत्वपूर्ण समय के दौरान मेरे जीवन में एक बहुत बड़ा दुख आया – मेरी दादी का निधन हो गया। मैं अपनी दादी से बेहद करीब थी। वह न सिर्फ मेरी मार्गदर्शिका थीं, बल्कि मेरी सबसे अच्छी दोस्त भी थीं। उनके साथ बिताए गए हर पल मेरे लिए अनमोल थे।

उनके निधन का समाचार मेरे लिए सदमे जैसा था। मैं मानसिक रूप से पूरी तरह टूट चुकी थी। एक तरफ बोर्ड परीक्षा का तनाव और दूसरी तरफ दादी की मौत का दुख। यह समय मेरे जीवन का सबसे कठिन समय था। लेकिन मैंने हार नहीं मानी और खुद को संभालने का प्रयास किया।

इस कठिन समय से बाहर निकलने के लिए मेरे पास कई कारण थे। मेरे प्रियजनों ने मेरी बहुत मदद की। सबसे पहले, मेरे माता-पिता का समर्थन। उन्होंने मुझे भावनात्मक रूप से संभाला और मुझे विश्वास दिलाया कि मैं इस कठिन समय से गुजर सकती हूँ। उन्होंने मुझे हमेशा प्रोत्साहित किया और मेरे साथ खड़े रहे।

दूसरा कारण था मेरी दादी की यादें और उनकी सिखाई हुई बातें। मेरी दादी हमेशा कहती थीं कि "जीवन में कोई भी कठिनाई स्थायी नहीं होती, बस हमें उसे धैर्य और साहस के साथ पार करना होता है।" उनकी यह बातें मुझे हिम्मत देती थीं और मुझे प्रेरित करती थीं कि मैं अपने लक्ष्य की ओर बढ़ती रहूँ।

तीसरा कारण था मेरा खुद पर विश्वास। मैंने ठान लिया था कि मैं अपनी दादी की यादों को अपनी कमजोरी नहीं, बल्कि अपनी ताकत बनाऊंगी। मैंने उनकी याद में अधिक मेहनत की और अपनी पढ़ाई पर ध्यान केंद्रित किया।

इन सबके बावजूद, यह समय आसान नहीं था। लेकिन हर दिन थोड़ा-थोड़ा करके मैंने खुद को मजबूत बनाया। मैंने अपनी भावनाओं को पढ़ाई के रूप में व्यक्त किया और परीक्षा की तैयारी में जुट गई। और अंततः, मैंने अपने बोर्ड परीक्षा में अच्छे अंक प्राप्त किए।

इस घटना ने मुझे सिखाया कि जीवन में संघर्षशीलता कितनी महत्वपूर्ण है। यह हमें कठिनाइयों से लड़ने की ताकत देती है और हमें हर परिस्थिति में मजबूत बनाती है। मेरी दादी का निधन और उस समय का संघर्ष मेरे जीवन का एक महत्वपूर्ण हिस्सा है, जिसने मुझे न केवल एक अच्छा छात्र बनाया बल्कि एक मजबूत इंसान भी बनाया।

इस अनुभव ने मुझे यह भी सिखाया कि जीवन में हर कठिनाई के बाद एक नया सवेरा जरूर आएगा। हमें बस धैर्य और आत्मविश्वास के साथ उस अंधकार को पार करना होता है। आज, मैं अपने जीवन के हर संघर्ष का सामना करने के लिए तैयार हूँ, क्योंकि मैंने जान लिया है कि मेरे अंदर वह ताकत है जो किसी भी मुश्किल को पार कर सकती है।

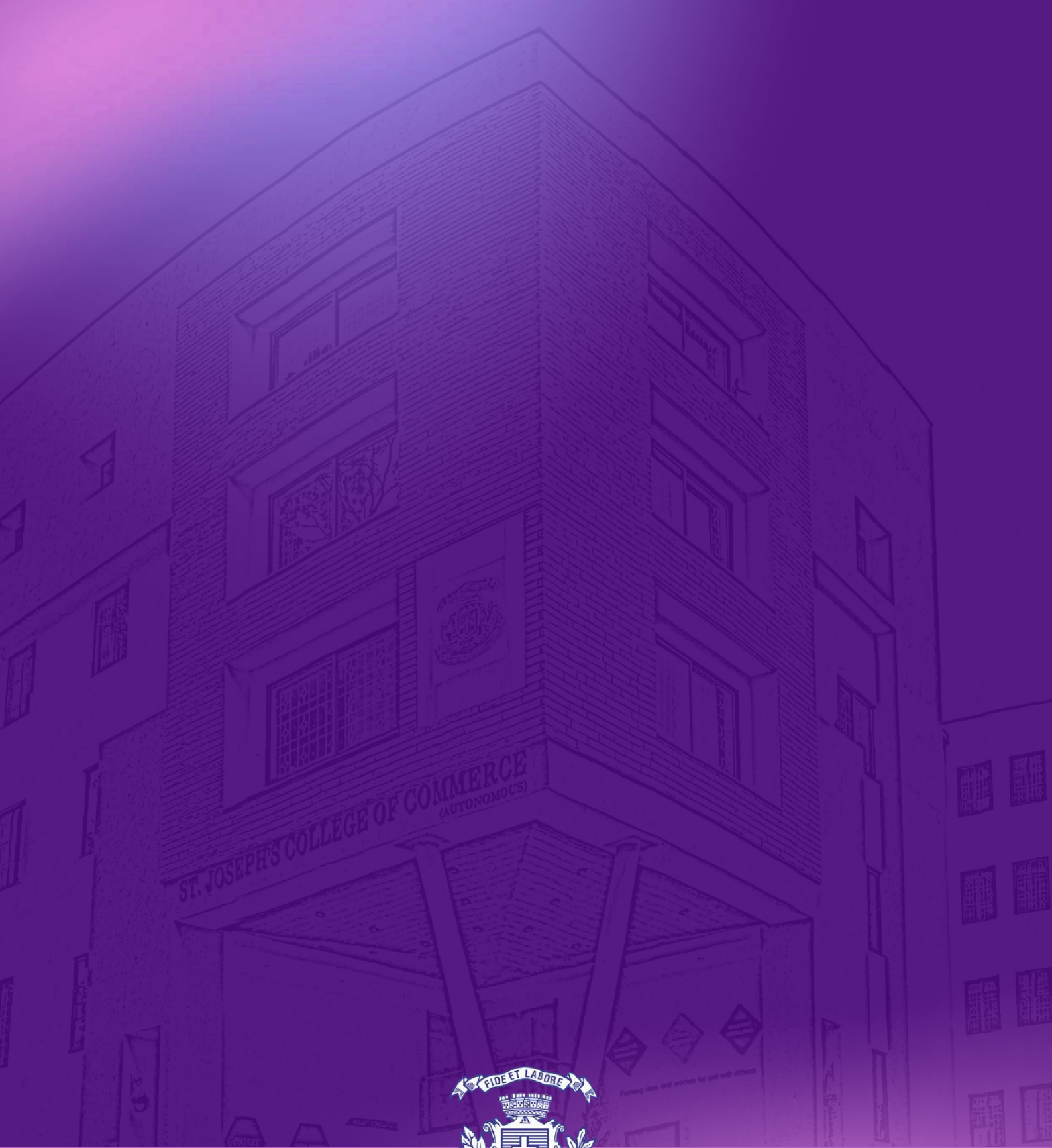
