About the Institutions

St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous)

St Joseph's College of Commerce (SJCC) formerly a part of St. Joseph's College, established in the year 1882, is managed by the Bangalore Jesuit Educational Society (BJES). The Commerce Department was established in the year 1949 and it became an independent college with its own building in Brigade Road in the year 1972.

The college has in its Vision a model for higher education which encourages individuals to dream of a socially just world and in its Mission a strategy to empower individuals in realizing that dream. With an objective of imparting quality education in the field of Commerce and Management, the college has been innovating in all aspects of higher education over a long period of time. These innovations were further bolstered with the granting of autonomous status to the college by UGC in September 2005. From then on, the college has taken a lead in reforming curriculum and syllabus, examination and evaluation pattern, and teaching and learning methods through the Board of Studies, the Academic Council and the Governing Council composed of eminent academicians, industry representatives and notable alumni.

The college has undergone four cycles of NAAC accreditation starting from the year 2000 in which it secured 'five stars', next in the year 2007 an 'A' grade, in the year 2012 again an 'A' grade and recently in February 2021 an 'A++'. It is one of the very few institutions in the country to have secured A++ grade in the fourth cycle under the Revised Accreditation Framework (RAF) and the first college in Karnataka to do so. The college was declared as a 'College with Potential for Excellence' in the year 2010. In 2011, SJCC was recognized as a Research Centre by Bangalore University. The college has consistently been ranked among the top 100 colleges in the country by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), Ministry of Education, Government of India, since its inception in 2017.

Karnataka Jesuit Higher Education Commission (KJHEC)

Karnataka Jesuit Higher Education Commission (KJHEC) is a body of educators – both Jesuit and lay – involved in higher education in Jesuit institutions in Karnataka. As an academic body, KJHEC strives to bring about greater collaboration and networking among Jesuit and other higher education institutions. It also deliberates on issues of concern in higher education in Karnataka and India and seeks viable measures and methods to deal with them constructively.

St. Joseph's University

St Joseph's University is a Jesuit university at the heart of Bengaluru, the silicon city of India. Established in 1882 by Paris Foreign Mission Fathers, the management of the college was handed over to the Jesuit order (Society of Jesus) in 1937. The college was first affiliated with the University of Madras and later with the Mysore and Bangalore universities. In 1986, St Joseph's College became the first affiliated college in Karnataka to offer postgraduate programmes. In 1988, it became the first college in Karnataka to get a Research Centre, and in 2005, it was one of colleges in Karnataka that was awarded academic autonomy. In February 2021, St Joseph's University Bill was presented in the Karnataka Legislative Assembly and was subsequently passed by the Legislative Assembly and Karnataka Legislative Councill. The college received its University status on 2 July 2022 and was inaugurated as India's first Public-Private-Partnership University by the Honourable President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu on 27 September 2022.

St. Aloysius (Deemed to be University)

St Aloysius (Deemed to be University), located in Mangaluru, Karnataka, is a prestigious institution founded in 1880 under the guidance of the Society of Jesus. It achieved Deemed University status in January 2024 and currently serves over 3500 students across a wide range of academic programs, including certificate, undergraduate, postgraudate and doctoral degrees in fields such as humanities, sciences, commerce, management, computer science, animation, teacher education and vocational studies. Renowned for its academic excellence, the university holds an A++ NAAC accreditation with a CGPA of 3.67/4 and ranks 73rd in the NIRF 2025 by the Ministry of Education. It has earned recognitions, including Autonomous Status (2007), "Institution with Potential for Excellence" (UGC, 2009), "Star Status" (DBT, 2016) and research capacity grants under the UGC STRIDE and DBT Builder schemes. Guided by its motto "Lucet et Ardet" meaning "Shine to Enkindle", the university fosters holistic development through rigorous academics, vibrant extracurriculars and a strong emphasis on research and innovation.



About Swasthya

Swasthya is a National Mental Health Workshop that provides a collaborative platform for students, the public, and mental health professionals to engage in meaningful dialogue around mental health and wellbeing. The term Swasthya, derived from Sanskrit, signifies holistic health, encompassing the body, mind, and spirit. This principle guides the workshop's focus on fostering comprehensive mental health, resilience, and spiritual wellbeing among youth. The workshop also addresses the unique challenges faced by today's youth—including stress, anxiety, social pressures, digital overload, and identity exploration—highlighting the importance of understanding, supporting, and promoting their mental health experiences.

Spanning two days, the workshop will feature nine carefully designed sessions, including keynote conversations, hands-on experiential workshops, interactive panel discussions, and engagement with leading experts. Participants will explore contemporary themes of psychological wellbeing and spirituality, examine how youth express and experience mental health, and identify practical strategies to enhance awareness, empathy, and resilience.

By fostering open dialogue, reflection, and experiential learning, Swasthya aims to bridge gaps between generations, mental health professionals, and young individuals, encouraging understanding and destignatizing conversations around mental health. Participants will gain valuable insights into the lived experiences of youth while exploring interventions and approaches to promote holistic wellbeing.

This initiative is a collaborative effort of St. Joseph's College of Commerce (Autonomous), Karnataka Jesuit Higher Education Commission (KJHEC), St Joseph's University, and St. Aloysius (Deemed to be University), reflecting a shared commitment to advancing mental health awareness, education, and dialogue across communities.
